Lent, just like the rest of Christian life, only more so.

This year we are doing Lent a little differently. Because we are focused on the great themes of the Old Testament in worship throughout this year, we will consider Lent through the Old Testament stories that shaped Jesus' own identity and mission. Those stories shaped Jesus' own life and mission as well as how the disciples and ordinary people understood his journey to Jerusalem and the cross. During Jesus' lifetime the only scripture that existed was the Old Testament and Jesus quotes from it regularly to make sense of his ministry and ultimately his death and resurrection.

Jesus' own life and work were decisively shaped by the accounts of Moses and the Exodus. The Gospel of Matthew almost presents Jesus as a new Moses. Jesus' death and resurrection are grounded in the story of Passover in which God led the people of Israel through death into life. His passion is rooted in the suffering servant songs of Isaiah and the laments of the righteous sufferer in the Psalms. Jesus' own saving death makes sense only in the context of the blood atonement for sin described in Leviticus. The Vision of Christ coming again as savior and judge, follows the prophecy of the coming of the Son of Man in Daniel. And the office of Messiah is explained in Isaiah, Zechariah, Malachi and elsewhere in the Old Testament. The Old Testament provides the foundation and the plot for the New Testament.

This Lent, together with our friends from Hilliard United Methodist Church, we will be examining the great story of the Old Testament in detail but we will be reading and examining it in three different ways. Starting on Tuesday March 8, we will be looking at the Old Testament lessons on Tuesday nights through the creative and imaginative lens of artists, poets, and children. On Wednesday nights, we will be looking at the stories of the Old Testament using the methods of mystics and contemplatives. And on Thursday nights, we will be reading the Old Testament lessons from the perspective of Bible scholars.

How you read a story matters. The methods and assumptions we bring to the text lead to different conclusions. Join us throughout Lent as we consider the story of God and God's people together.

#### LECTIO FOR LENT

We believe that God communicates with human beings through the medium of language. While the divinities of other religions are known through nature or soaring temples, our God is known through the revelation of the spoken and then the written word. Tested and refined, that word becomes scripture, the holy books we simply call "the books," except we do it in Greek, hence Bible. For Christians, we believe that in and through the "words" of scripture we may encounter the "Word" of God, God's intentional, outreaching, transformative persona that we believe took on human flesh in the person of Jesus of Nazareth. Reading scripture is how we seek Jesus.

Throughout Lent we will be sharing in this essential Christian practice of reading in three different modes. We will be sharing with our friends from Hilliard United Methodist as we practice three different ways of reading because how we read shapes what we discover.

#### Tuesdays in Lent: Soul Stories

On Tuesday nights, we will be using the creative and imaginative invitation of Godly Play to enter scripture through the portal of artists, poets, and children, to visualize, reconsider, question, rearrange, and generally play with the text. This approach seeks to embrace scripture as our own soul story.

#### Wednesdays in Lent: Lectio Divina

On Wednesday nights, we will be following in the traditions of Christian contemplatives and mystics practicing *Lectio Divina*, literally divine reading. This ancient practice leads one from recitation through prayer, application, and ultimately contemplation. For many Christian contemplatives over the past 17 centuries, the daily practice of Lectio has been the foundation of their faith as it seeks to help the reader use scripture to lose oneself in God.

#### Thursdays in Lent: Beth Midrash, the house of study

Finally on Thursday nights we will be following the path of scholars, critically examining the language, context, history, and impact of the text using the very best scholarship we can bring to the text as we seek to understand both what a text meant in its original context and how it connects to the rest of scripture and God unfolding work in the world.

#### TREASURER'S REPORT

Your Endowment Fund Facts

With the congregational meeting of December behind us, I felt some additional facts may be of use to answer or prompt additional questions. Please let me know if these facts need additional transparency or raise additional questions.

The Fairmont Endowment was started in 1976 By the end of 1996 the total net value had increased to \$771,938.69.

Since 1997 the principal (Gifts received) has grown from \$600,000 to \$1,444,094.29 at the end of 2021.

The total value of the Endowment Principal Fund at the end of 2021 was \$2,184,429.45. This includes unrealized gains of 740,335.20 (\$2,184,429.45 minus \$1,444,094.29)

The Endowment Income Fund receives all interest and dividends earned by the Endowment Principal Fund.

The Endowment Income Fund paid for \$1,859,422.56 of Fairmont Presbyterian Church capital improvements since 1998.

None of the expenditures come from the Operating Budget that you provide for through your yearly pledges

All of the above accurately reflect the status of the entire Endowment Fund as of December 31, 2021. It includes the transaction you approved at the congregational meeting of \$209,400. This was taken from the unrealized gains (value increase) of the Endowment Principal Fund and not from the Gift derived Endowment Principal. This principal will not be touched without a 2/3 approval of the Finance Team, Trustees, Session, and members of Fairmont Presbyterian Church.

#### Kettering Backpack Program

This organization provides nearly 600 needy children enrolled in Kettering City Schools with nutritious food to consume every weekend throughout the school year. The students are identified by school counselors and are discretely provided a sack of nutritious food that includes milk, fruit, pudding, juice, vegetables, apple sauce, macaroni and peanut butter. Due to COVID-19, the number of hungry students has risen, causing the program's food costs to increase greatly. ## **Dayton Food Bank**

#### (South Dayton Foodbank/FISH)

The Dayton Food Bank has served as the primary source of food for the hunger relief network in the Miami Valley. This food bank-the only one of its kind in the area-relieves hunger in the community through a network of partner agencies by acquiring and distributing food. The food bank provides the infrastructure for more than 100 member food pantries, community kitchens and shelters that serve as the charitable hunger relief network in Montgomery, Greene, and Preble Counties, including the South Dayton Food Pantry/FISH, which serves Fairmont's immediate area.
