THOUGHTS FROM BRIAN

Advent is a season to remember ancient promises and their fulfilment. The story of the saving purposes of God does not begin in Bethlehem, but in Eden, or at least a little to the East of it. All the rest of scripture is a continuous narrative about God's redemption, correction, and transformation of human beings that stretches across sixty-six books and over a thousand years of composition. Both Testaments speak to the steadfast love of God who will not let us go.

Over the next two years, we will be examining those saving purposes of God in some detail in our worship. Rather than jump around in scripture every Sunday, we will be progressing chronologically through the major themes of the Old Testament in 2022 and the New in 2023. In doing so, we hope to reveal something of how the relationship between God and humanity evolves. That relationship responds to changes in history and changes in God, requiring both God and humanity to innovate and grow.

Sitting on the edge of Bethlehem, the great Judean Desert beckons. Out there in the wilderness, God will forge a people into a nation and in due time, a world into a people. That is the story we will be considering from its beginning to, if not its conclusion, then at least to our part in it.

With the incarnation of God in Jesus Christ, we are all now a part of that story. As we study it, we discover not only who God is, but who we are as well.

Advent Waiting

"Are you the one who is to come, or are we to wait for another?" -Matthew 11:3

From prison, John the Baptist, sent word through his followers to Jesus. "Are you the one who is to come, or are we to wait for another?" John knew the messiah was coming into the world. This Jesus lived out compassion and righteousness like none other John had seen. Surely Jesus was the one? Even at the end of his life, John longed for the promised one, the long-awaited one, the messiah.

We have moved into the season of Advent with barely a word of notice. Our post pandemic days have blurred into one another as we continue to find our way - a new way - as God's people together. We await our savior. We await with joyful and much needed anticipation the incarnation of Jesus in our lives, in our Advent waiting, in our hope for future days. God, Emmanuel, is with us yesterday, today, and forever. We cry out from our own prisons of fear, fatigue, and fickle faith, "Are you the one who is to come?" We wait for you, O God. Come, Lord Jesus.

December marks the season of Advent, the beginning of the new church year in the liturgical calendar of our faith. Advent is a time of preparation, anticipation, and longing for the coming of the Christ Child. Advent is a time to prepare our hearts for a new beginning. A beginning again. The word Advent comes from the Latin word "adventus" meaning "arriving."

The colors of Advent are blue or purple depending upon your church tradition. **The color purple represents repentance and fasting. The color blue represents hope.** We need both repentance and hope. In Advent we prepare ourselves for the coming of Christ through repentance with hope that the Messiah will indeed come to redeem us. Advent tells us to slow down and wait while our world around us tells us to get going and get shopping. This is the struggle of our hearts and this Advent season - to wait for God. To be still and wait. To prepare our hearts for God.

STEWARDSHIP SEASON 2021

The rest of the story....

During this stewardship season, as Treasurer of this remarkable community of Christians, I would like to comment on our financial status.

We are coming out of the pandemic as strong as ever. Our pledges have remained constant, and I see no reason to expect any contraction in our new pledges. As most of you know, our pledges support our wonderful staff, our excellent programs, and the mundane day-to-day expenses to keep our doors open.

What some of you may not have an appreciation for is the Fairmont Endowment Fund. This fund was started in 1976 with a modest sum that reached \$600,000 in gifts by 1997. During the 45 years of financial management, this fund has taken care of all major maintenance items. Additional gifts to the endowment have totaled more than \$1,000,000. Total disbursements from this fund have totaled over \$2,000,000. As of the end of October the Total Endowment has \$2,383,795. What a wonderful blessing we have.

What is Per Capita and why is it \$52.23? The Presbyterian Church is a connectional church. That means that we share in mutual ministry and accountability with and for each other. One of the ways we do that is by sharing in the cost of the denomination. This is done through individual assessments based on the number of members in each church. These assessments, called "per capita," are mandatory and are used to support the work of the General Assembly and the Synod. Those funds are obtained either from our general Fairmont revenues or from special offerings of individuals who wish to pay their share individually. The total per member assessment for 2020 is \$52.23. That is the cost of being a member of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) denomination as opposed to the local congregation. If you would like to directly pay your share of our commitment to the greater church, the amount per member is \$52.23.

Thank You! Thank you for your generous financial support throughout 2021. Because of your generosity we have been able to grow our ministries and outreach, especially through live streaming. We have returned to live worship and programs. We have refurbished our elevator and made huge strides in improving our church's technology. All of it depends on your generous support. You are making Fairmont a great and thriving house of faith.

Progress in the 2022 financial stewardship campaign is encouraging as of mid-November, and we are closing in on our goal of fully funding our proposed budget of \$675,365. The ultimate success of our 2022 Stewardship campaign depends on you. If you have already pledged for 2022 we sincerely thank you. If you have not yet done so, please →

pledge some amount to the mission of Fairmont. God has a plan for Fairmont and we hope that you will pledge to help achieve it with your financial support!

A Different Kind of Gift? - In support of global outreach, you could consider a gift through Presbyterian Mission's Giving Catalogue. You may donate to any of 40 different projects worldwide. Catalogs are available on the Mission information table.

Free Money: Taxpayers over 70 1/2 years of age with an IRA or a 401K/403B accounts may transfer withdrawals (up to \$100,000 per year) directly to Fairmont Presbyterian Church or other "qualified charitable organizations" and not pay tax on the distribution. Retirement savings accounts of various sorts require individuals over 72 to annually make required minimum distributions or face significant tax penalties. Those distributions are then added to your taxable income, often boosting your tax bracket. But, if you direct those distributions in whole or in part to Fairmont or other charities, those funds do not count as taxable income. This transfer method can save you significant tax dollars. As always, consult with qualified advisors to help with tax planning, but using qualified charitable distributions may be a tax efficient way for you to support Fairmont! All such qualified.

Some Christian symbols used are crosses, fish, stars, crowns, shepherd's staff, doves, and candles. The colors used for the ornaments are white and gold. Please take an extra look at these meaningful ornaments. You can find directions on the internet on how to make your own Chrismons for your Christmas tree at home. A beautiful, new Christmas tree has been purchased for Fellowship Hall to help make the 8:30 service special. Lorelei has been working with the children on a Christmas pageant for December 19th. Brian and Kelley will be giving meaningful sermons during this Christmas season. We are thankful to have Christmas Eve services inside our church this year.
