Heritage is the gift of living traditions that inform and shape our lives. Heritage reminds us that the living are not the sole determiners of our present. The dead are never gone. Heritage is the pattern of living entrusted to us by the dead. The values, insights, and discoveries of past generations are encoded in our habits, patterns of culture, beliefs, and practices that we inhabit. We live in the world (both externally and internally) that they made just as our descendants will inhabit the worlds that we make. Heritage is therefore both a gift for us and our responsibility for the future.

We celebrate our Presbyterian heritage in October. Our ancestors in faith were an irascible bunch of Scots who refused to accept simple answers that were given to them by religious authorities. They demonstrated an allergy to anyone who styled himself, "bishop." Our ancestors were also convinced that we are all, to greater or lesser degrees, messed up. They were less interested in expressing their authentic identity than they were in replacing it with God's. They valued the study of scripture and its practical lived application in the daily lives of every person denying any distinction between "clergy" and "lay" people as utterly alien to Jesus' ministry. Ministers were distinguished solely by their function as teachers not their proximity to God. Most of all they centered their faith, hope, and perseverance on God alone who was the ultimate subject, cause, agent, and destiny of all. Coincidentally, they organized their churches around representative bodies of elected elders, which was revolutionary at the time when all other churches were led by the appointees of kings and bishops. To make that radical form of egalitarian government a bit more palatable, they used the Greek name for elders (Presbuteros) drawn from the Book of Acts' descriptions of the leadership of the early church, hence Presbyterian.

The real question of heritage is what do we bequeath to the next generation? This is especially pressing for us because so few of us nowadays were raised as Presbyterians. Fewer and fewer people are socialized into Christianity in childhood. We are becoming again what we once were, a community of converts. What do we hold so precious that we would sacrifice to share it with future generations? Beyond the bagpipes and kilts, lies the ultimate question. What is our commitment to the future and our stewardship of that shared inheritance?

So, what do we commit to give to the next generation? What will we sacrifice and what will we labor to share? One hundred generations of saints before us await our answer.

MISSION BEYOND THE CONGREGATION



Dayton Food Bank (South Dayton Foodbank/ FISH)

Dayton Food Bank serves as the primary source of food for the hunger relief network in the Miami Valley. This food bank relieves hunger in the community through a network of partner agencies by acquiring and distributing food. The food bank provides the infrastructure for more than 100-member food pantries, community kitchens, and shelters that serve as the charitable hunger relief network in Greene, Montgomery, and Preble Counties, including the South Dayton Food Pantry/FISH, which serves Fairmont's immediate area. You may give through Fairmont's online Portal of Giving at www.fairmontchurch.org (note Dayton Food Bank in the "Other" box) or by mailing a check to Fairmont Presbyterian Church with "Dayton Food Bank" in the memo line.

Kettering Backpack Program

This organization provides nearly 600 needy children enrolled in Kettering City Schools with nutritious food to consume every weekend throughout the school year. The students are identified by school counselors and are discretely provided a sack of nutritious food that includes milk, fruit, pudding, juice, vegetables, applesauce, macaroni and cheese, and peanut butter. The number of hungry students has risen, causing the program's food costs to increase greatly. Financial donations may be made through Fairmont's Online Giving Portal on the website marked "Backpack Program." Thank you for your support.

FAIRMONT CARES: LINCOLN PARK

Did you know that Fairmont provides a monthly communion service of worship at Lincoln Park retirement community?
