

Border Security and Immigration Reform Agreement

If elected (or re-elected) to the United States Congress, I agree to hold the federal government accountable for its Constitutional obligation to protect national sovereignty and to support the following border security and immigration reform provisions:

- -The most cost-effective border security possible including funding for additional personnel, equipment, infrastructure, and where practical and appropriate, structural barriers
- -An increase in judicial and incarceration capacity
- -No amnesty for anyone, with the possible exception of DACA recipients
- -No new path to citizenship for anyone, with the possible exception of DACA recipients
- -Earned legal status for illegal aliens only if they meet certain strict requirements such as restitution, length of residency, work history, criminal background checks, etc.
- -Illegal aliens who earn legal status must go to the back of the line and be afforded no special privileges through the existing citizenship application process
- -A limited guest worker program that does not displace any U.S. citizen worker and only permits the numbers and tenure of workers proven to be needed by American businesses and industries
- -Upon the implementation of an effective identification system for guest workers and other legal workers, the harsh sanctioning of businesses who hire illegal workers
- -Addressing the root causes of illegal immigration from originating countries, particularly those in the Western Hemisphere
