Guidelines for Transitional Operation

Transitional rules for playing Bocce will be as follows:

- Only members are allowed on the courts, no guests or children.
 - If non-members want to play, they must first join the club. This gives them access to all club announcements.
- A monitor will be on duty when play is allowed – no monitor, no play.
 - Monitors can play; however, they are expected to perform the following duties:
 - They will be the only ones to have access to the shed.
 - They will issue the supplies from the shed.
 - They will ensure the rules are followed.
 - They will draw and announce the “chips” for random selection of opponents and courts. **NO GATHERING OF PLAYERS DURING THE DRAW.**
 - Chips will be disinfected before and after use.
- Limited access to items in the shed
 - Only the board and monitors will have the combination to the shed.
 - All items will remain in the shed, until full opening.
 - Pens, clip boards, balls and crates are to be sprayed with disinfectant (supplied by the club) before play, before transition to new players and before they are returned to the shed.
 - Do not use club supplied water in the shed, bring your own water.
- Until otherwise advised, restrooms and water fountains will be closed, so prepare accordingly.
- The court peg boards will not be used to keep score.
- Face masks are optional
- Sanitizing your hands before and after play is expected.
 - Players must bring their own sanitizer.
- Singles play only per court (only 2 people per court)
 - Each player will use the same color balls for the entire period of play.
- No more than 10 players will be allowed in the playing area at a time.
 - Efforts should be made to keep an idled court between each active court.
 - Players waiting to play, can wait on the patio, **maintaining social distancing guidelines.**
 - If there are people waiting, play should be limited to one game.
- Efforts will be made to maintain current the activities on the current calendar, except those activities that may encourage groups; social activities and training will not occur.

These guidelines are tentative and subject to change based on further communications from the authorities.
