

Hello, California CattleWomen!

Fellow California CattleWomen, Inc. members, I would personally like to thank all of you for making our organization such a success by contributing your time, money, and expertise to promote **BEEF!** As cattle numbers continue to dwindle across the United States those that forecast believe that the prices will continue to grow higher, so that is good news. On the bleaker side of the cattle business, there are still many influencers that would like to see meat removed, or drastically reduced, in the American diet replaced by other protein sources. Therefore, we are still an extremely important cog in reaching out to consumers and future consumers with the truth!

Last year, 20,367 California students were reached, and that number only reflects those units that sent in their reports to Candance Cook Peterson, Chairman of Ag in the Classroom. At the CCA/CCW Convention the following units received awards as follows: Kern County, 1st place, reaching 6,300 students; second place San Joaquin/Stanislaus educated 4,607 children; Valley Cowbelles reached a total of 3,500 students; Siskiyou and Alameda units each reached a 1,000.

Our units are out and about reading to students again, so this years Star Readers were as follows, 1st place San Joaquin/Stanislaus, where each individual member went to a school and read a book and answered questions. The second place went to Myra Davies of Placer/Nevada CattleWomen.

Another area of awards presented were tallied by our outgoing and exemplary Beef Promotion Chairman, Stacey Jackson. The awards presented were, Most Volunteer Hours: Placer/Nevada; Most Volunteer Members: Siskiyou County; Highest Number of Print and Social Media: Placer/Nevada, Best Float and Parade Participation: Santa Barbara County.

The coveted Walt Rodman Award, largest unit, was presented to Siskiyou County CattleWomen, and the smaller unit award to Santa Barbara County CattleWomen.

Attention all CattleWomen, make plans to come to Las Cruces, New Mexico, on April 11-13, 2024. The region meeting will take place on New Mexico State University's campus. The New Mexico CowBelles have put together a fantastic agenda for this meeting.

Some of the topics we will be talking about at the meeting include; Virtual fencing, a relatively new technology, which allows ranchers to control livestock distribution in rangeland landscapes without physical fences. The livestock wear a collar that communicates with GPS and reception towers to form a virtual fence set by the rancher or land manager. Cattle have demonstrated the ability and tendency to rapidly learn virtual fencing cues, eventually responding to the audio clue alone. Some studies are taking place at New Mexico State University and will most likely be shared about further at our meeting.

In regards to our ANCW Region VI Elections: we will be holding a year election for the following committees: Budget, Membership, Public Relations, Ways & Means, and your Region VI Director. Standing Committee Reports will be given as well.

Ladies will also have the opportunity to hear from the consulting dietician Kate Schulz, RDN, LD, LMNT as she serves as a consultant for the New Mexico Beef Council and Colorado Beef Council. From the New Mexico Beef Councils story in 2022, "Kate is an RD who just so happened to find a career representing farmers and ranchers. She thinks it is the perfect combination of what she does and where she comes from." We all are looking forward to hearing from her.

Everyone will have the opportunity to tour the brand-new meat lab, feed mill, and processing floor at New Mexico State University.

The first day of meetings will conclude with everyone enjoying dinner at the New Mexico Farm and Heritage Museum. This museum is a real treat to visit as it showcases the history of farming and ranching in an interactive exhibit. In regards to getting to Las Cruces, New Mexico, you can fly directly into El Paso, Texas then drive 45 minutes to Las Cruces. Attorney General & DOJ Update for Affiliate Units

INGREDIENTS:

1 boneless beef Brisket (2-1/2 to 3 pounds)

1/2 cup chopped onion

5 cups sliced or baby carrots

1/4 cup packed brown sugar

1 tablespoon fresh lemon juice

1 teaspoon salt

1/2 teaspoon ground cinnamon

1/2 teaspoon pepper


8 ounces pitted prunes



COOKING INSTRUCTIONS:

- 1. Heat large stock pot over medium heat until hot. Place beef Brisket in stockpot; brown evenly. Remove brisket. Pour off drippings, if necessary.
- 2. Add onion to stock pot; cook and stir 5 minutes or until tender. Add 1 cup water; cook 1 to 2 minutes until browned bits attached to skillet are dissolved. Return brisket; bring to a boil. Reduce heat; cover tightly. Simmer 2-3/4 to 3-1/4 hours. Add carrots, brown sugar, lemon juice, salt, cinnamon, pepper and prunes; continue cooking, covered, 30 minutes or until brisket is fork-tender. Remove brisket, carrots, and prunes; keep warm.
- 3. Bring cooking liquid to a boil; cook, uncovered, over medium-high heat 5 to 7 minutes or until liquid is reduced to 1 cup. Trim fat from brisket; carve diagonally across the grain. Serve with carrots, prunes, and sauce.
