

California Farm Bureau 2022 Young Farmers & Ranchers Collegiate Discussion Meet

Background

The Collegiate Discussion Meet is a competitive event promoted by the California Farm Bureau (CAF) Young Farmers & Ranchers (YF&R) Committee. The Farm Bureau's strength depends on its members' ability to analyze agricultural issues and decide on solutions that best meet their needs. The competitive event is designed to simulate a committee meeting where discussion and active participation are expected from each committee member. Contestants build basic discussion skills, develop a keen understanding of important agricultural issues, and explore how groups can pool knowledge to reach consensus and solve problems. **A successful contestant is a productive thinker rather than an emotional persuader. He/she will assist the group in creating ways to implement the solutions discussed and highlight Farm Bureau's involvement in those actions/steps.** The California Farm Bureau provides, as part of the state recognition award to the winner, an expenses-paid trip to the **2023 AFBF Fusion Conference held in Florida**. The AFBF YF&R Committee and the AFB Organization Department will coordinate the program at the national level.

Information about the Discussion Meet contestant is requested on the entry form. ALL INFORMATION IS HANDLED IN STRICT CONFIDENCE.

Eligibility

- Contestant shall be a collegiate Farm Bureau member and be between the ages of 18 and 35. The individual shall not have reached his/her 36th birthday by January 31.
- Contestant must be an undergraduate college student at the time of the state competition at either a junior or senior level California accredited college.
- Contestant shall not be enrolled in a graduate-level program at the time of his/her state Collegiate Discussion Meet competitive event.
- Contestant must display a sincere interest in the agricultural industry.
- Contestant may only compete in one national YF&R Competitive Event per year.
- Past and present members of the AFBF Young Farmers & Ranchers Committee and/or their spouse/spousal-equivalents are not eligible to compete.
- Past state YF&R Collegiate Discussion Meet winners and/or previous AFBF Collegiate Discussion Meet competitors cannot compete.
- Past state YF&R Discussion Meet winners and/or previous AFBF Discussion Meet competitors are not eligible to compete.
- Current employees of the county, state and/or American Farm Bureaus and their affiliates are not eligible to compete.
- Professional speakers are not eligible to compete. Professional speakers are those who have received a fee, royalty, or honorarium for speaking (i.e., paid speaking appearances or speaking engagements) within 24 months prior to this annual competition. This excludes reimbursement for travel or expenses attendant to the appearance.

Entry Form & Application Guidelines

- The application must be properly signed by the student's Professor (either the student's academic advisor or instructor of the currently enrolled course) verifying that the student is enrolled at the indicated college.

Note: Disregarding any of the guidelines listed above will result in disqualification.

Competition

- The contestants will discuss pre-selected topics with four, fundamental bases for the general discussion: cooperation, constructive criticism, problem solving and communication.
- The competitive event will consist of four rounds: two Round Robins, Elite Eight and Final Four.
 - All competitors will compete in the first two rounds. The top eight competitors based on judges' scores will move on to the Elite Eight round.
 - The top two competitors in each of the third round rooms will move on to the Final Four round in order to determine the winner.
- Each round will begin with a 30-second opening statement and end with a one-minute closing statement by each contestant.
- Contestants will have 20-25 minutes of open discussion dependent upon the number of contestants, followed by one minute of quiet time.
