King will explore how and why the Black community must remember our Ancestors to deepen our sense of identity and to restore hope and healing for our children and future generations.

Dr. Joyce E. King is the Benjamin E. Mays Endowed Chair for Urban Teaching, Learning, and Leadership and Professor of Educational Policy Studies in the College of Education & Human Development at Georgia State University. Widely respected in the fields of urban education and the sociology of education, King's research has contributed to the knowledge base on preparing teachers for diversity and curriculum theorizing through her scholarship, teaching practice and leadership. She served on the Curriculum Commission of the State Board of Education.
