The Michigan Department of Health and Human Services, Office of Policy and Planning is seeking nominations for a statewide Community Information Exchange (CIE) Task Force that will launch in August 2022.

Community Information Exchange (CIE) is a localized effort to create and sustain the technology and relationships required to support Social Determinants of Health (SDOH) needs of both individual and community. CIE maximizes a person-centered approach by ensuring social care information is collected only as needed and is stored safely. CIE also promotes streamlined access to health enhancing non-clinical services (e.g., social services and supports), helping to coordinate care across a variety of clinical and non-clinical partners, while using data on existing community resources, needs, and gaps to drive policy change.

The CIE Taskforce will bring together community-based organizations (CBOs), health care, health IT, and governmental entities whose aligned work and interests are best served by a coordinated approach to CIE. This taskforce will develop a statewide blueprint for CIE, honoring that coordinated care and health equity, supported by electronic exchange of information, is vital to improving the overall health and well-being of individuals. Attached is a draft [CIE Task Force Charter](#) outlining the goals and parameters for the task force. The task force will revise and finalize this document at its first meeting in August.

Membership is expected to include 8-12 representatives of entities or communities with a stake in CIE and up to two designated liaisons from Michigan HIT Commission, including:

1. Representative(s) of social service organizations and CBOs.
2. Representative(s) of organizations that advocate for or serve communities who face health inequities.
3. Representative(s) of organizations implementing or using CIE.
4. Consumers of health care/social services or representative(s) from organizations that advocate for consumers of health care/social services.
5. Representative(s) of health care, such as health systems, CCOs, local public health agencies, clinics, and/or health care providers.
6. Representative(s) of behavioral health, such as behavioral health providers or behavioral health organizations.
7. Up to two MHITC members designated to serve as MHITC liaisons.
8. Representative(s) of MiHIN.

We are soliciting your nominations for candidates who can effectively represent a broad constituency within their category of expertise. Ideal candidates will have broad level subject matter expertise in social care, health equity, and health IT, and represent a broader constituency of individuals in their field and/or community. Additionally, CIE Task Force members shall be racially, ethnically, and culturally representative of our state, bringing diverse perspectives shaped by professional and lived experience.
