Stewardship 2018—Answering the Call of Love & Justice

Dear UU Family and Friends -

This month's spiritual theme, *Emergence*, asks us to reflect on what "new we might emerge into." As we come close to the end of the formal part of the Stewardship campaign, we are inspired to reflect on what has emerged from our campaign.

We know that much of what we sowed has flowered. The commitment to our mission, our values, and all we do is revealed in our generosity: as of April 10, we raised \$385,500 from 70% of our pledging units, 37% of whom increased their pledges and only 19% who decreased their pledges. This was 85% of all we raised last year—and bodes well for our Society's financial health for 2018-19.

We also have been open to new ways of doing things, what the *Path's* introduction on *Emergence* calls "being open to a new path, walking with a new step, and being awakened to new songs all around us." We have started on a new path towards sustainable staffing, and will continue this journey despite detours along the way.

Emergence asks us to trust that a transformation need not be "a long and lonely struggle, but instead can be more like learning a new dance with a new friend. All we have to do is trust..." Your stewardship of our Society shows how true this is. We are in the early stages of changes and growth in our ministerial and staff structure and, while this is uncharted territory for us, we travel this path together as a congregation. We also know that the gratitude and generosity expressed in our pledges show our deeply rooted commitment to our UU values. This commitment is essential to our efforts to realize our Sustainable Staffing Plan, our "new dance steps."


Our collective strength, resilience, and power will lead us along the path through the next part of our journey, and beyond.

As your Stewardship Team, we are proud to be *emerging* with you, answering the call for love and justice within ourselves, among our members, and in the wider community beyond. Access ACS is your connection to the Society's database. By signing up, you will be able to:

- Update your personal information (address, phone number, email address, etc.)
- Check your personal pledge status
- Print a copy of your tax statement
- Update your skills and interests information
- Browse current opportunities for participation
- Add a photograph of you and/or your family
- Access the Society Directory
- View the Society Calendar
- We will be adding more options soon! (classes, groups, registration, pledge payment set-up, etc.)

Signing up is easy! Just click on this link:

uusociety.org/members/access-ac-members-stay-connected/ and you will be taken to a login page.

To obtain your login and password, look below the box to where it says, "Need a Login? Click Here," and click! Once you get your login, you can access all the above offerings by going to the Members tab on the website. Want to make it super easy? Bookmark the above link, then you'll be able to get to this spot with one click.



Do you want access to the Society Directory and Calendar while you're on the go? Go to the App Store and download the "Church Life" app. Use your same login and password, and you can have Access ACS everywhere you go!

Visiting a member but not sure where they live? Look them up in the Directory, click on their address, and up pops a Google map with directions to their house! Trying to schedule an event during a committee meeting? Look at the calendar in the Church Life app to see if the space is available that day!

What We Share with Other Faith Traditions: Classes on Islam at FUUSB

Have you ever read the Qur'an? Here is your chance! The Sanctuary and Solidarity Task Force seeks to deepen our understanding of Islam as a way to combat Islamophobia and be ready for solidarity actions with our neighbors of this faith. We sponsored a two-part film series in January and February. The films were "Inside Islam: A Sweeping Story of One of the World's Great Faiths" (produced by the History Channel) and "Inside Islam: What a Billion Muslims Really Think" (based on a Gallop poll). Thank you for making the film series a smashing success. Next, the Task Force has invited me to teach two classes about Islam, based partly on what we teach our seventh graders in the world religions program called Building Bridges (formerly known as Neighboring Faiths).

The first lesson, "Peace by Surrender," will cover the numbers of religious adherents, the life of Muhammed, the five pillars of Islam, and beliefs shared with Unitarian Universalism. We could also practice Muslim greetings and Arabic script. The second lesson on "Contemporary Issues" might include the division between Sunni and Shiite Muslims, comparisons between Islam and associated religions (Judaism, Christianity, Sufism, Sikhism, and Baha'i), the life of Khadijah, women's status, and Muslims in peace and conflict. We would have time for asking questions and having discussions. What topics do you want to learn about? Do you have pictures or objects to share?

Generally, we are thinking about ways to honor our value for religious pluralism with programming about the beliefs and practices of other faiths.

What faith traditions would you like to explore with other UUs? I would be willing to cooperatively lead and organize other classes like these, based on your interests.

New Horizons in Faith Formation

FUUSB has created an exciting vision for the future of Faith Formation by supporting the development of Family Ministry programming.

Family Ministry incorporates much of what we already understand about Religious Education, and it goes further, as well. Family Ministry utilizes curriculum-based faith formation. It also incorporates strong support of the family in faith formation, both at the Society and at home.

Family Ministry also has a wider reach. It prioritizes relationship and community building within the congregation. "Family," then, takes on a meaning that includes both related members of a family, as well as a larger sense of family that includes intergenerational relationships among congregants. To build beloved community, we share values and principles, and at the core it is about reaching out to know one another, to learn together, to support one another.

In a Family Ministry model, relationships are key, and multi-generational programming and faith formation provides opportunities to build relationships and friendships with individuals, youth and young adults, families, and across generations. Imagine all that we will learn from one another in intentional community building. All that we could experience, all that we could accomplish, all that we could envision, becomes incarnated love in our community.

Through the end of this year, over the summer, and throughout next year there will be several

opportunities to dialogue about what Family Ministry could look like here at FUUSB, to envision how we might integrate opportunities for service, justice-making, and faith formation with families and across generations.

The first opportunity for dialogue is on May 5. See the *eNews* for details and to register. Refreshments and child care are available.


