


Fifth Sunday Of Lent, March 29, 2020

On the Fifth Sunday of Lent, just before we begin to enter Holy Week, we are summoned to Bethany. If we had been friends of Mary, Lazarus, and Martha, and found out that Lazarus was gravely ill, we probably would have dropped everything to be with them. This was what was so surprising about the behavior of Jesus. Although He was their close friend, He chose to stay away, that God's glory would be manifested. This is a persistent theme in John's Gospel. Right to the very end, Jesus' works were meant to give glory to the Father.

As our Lenten journey reaches a crescendo, let us be mindful that, as people who have "put on Christ" in baptism, we are also called, by our attitudes and actions, to give glory to God.

Together, we can share faith and uplift one another... Isn't that what Church should be?

Elizabeth and I were on a cruise aboard the Grand Princess, when it turned into a "plague ship" with 21 confirmed cases of Covid-19 on board. We were among the lucky ones who were proved to be healthy and asymptomatic. We were immediately confined to our small cabins and the



ship altered course for California. While politicians argued, we remained at sea. We retained our calm by exchanging text messages with our family and friends from church (and temple). When finally allowed to disembark, we were put into strict government quarantine at Travis AFB. Again, electronics broadened our constricted world. When we heard that a St. Joe's parishioner was having heart surgery w/o his father, who was on duty guarding us, we were able to contact the father and tell him that the church was praying for him and his son. I was able to participate, electronically, in an RCIA Team Leaders meeting, and similarly arranged to lead the Sunday Dismissal.

We have heard from dozens of friends from church from Fr. Mario to Bible Study members. It is a strange contrast – we

are physically confined, but through the Internet we can touch hearts with our friends from Alameda, from other States, from Canada and Portugal and Macedonia. It reminds us that we are all part of a worldwide divine family even when we are physically confined. We will keep praying that this test of our faith will show that we trust in God, and obey the reasonable rules.

As I write this from my laptop at home, we are in the first week of "Shelter in Place." The first line of today's Gospel seems so timely! Illness is on everyone's minds: how to avoid getting ill, how to care for those who are ill, how to manage in this illness-induced reality of "social distancing" and empty shelves.



Normally at this time of year I would be focusing on doing the same things we do every year: Lent, with Soup Meals and Scrutinies and groups gathering for study and prayer. Getting ready for Easter Vigil with new members joining the Church through baptism, and Family Mass. First Communions following just weeks after Easter.

But this is not a normal time. Instead, we are operating day to day, considering what must be rescheduled, what must be canceled and what can be done differently. And together we are finding new and creative ways to observe Lent and attend classes and stay connected and "do Church." Our teachers are meeting with students online, continuing classes through technology and perseverance. The Young Adult Group gathers to pray the Rosary together, separated physically but united in faith (and Zoom). The RCIA team is working through conference calls and video conferencing to welcome inquirers and support and guide the catechumens, candidates and elect. Our clergy have stretched their skills to include livestreaming Mass, so we can still worship together. Faith Formation is working to reach students at home to offer online classes and Children's Liturgy of the Word. Staff is working from home using email and phone calls and internet to ensure needs are met as much as possible.

This is new territory, challenging and scary and uncertain, but also inspiring. We step back from the normal busy-ness of life and see with new eyes. We witness those who serve or share with compassion and generosity. We spend time with loved ones, maybe in person, maybe by Facetime or phone or mail. We pray for each other. We remember the words of Jesus:

I am the resurrection and the life; whoever believes in me, even if he dies, will live, and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die. Do you believe this?

Yes, Lord! We believe!

April is Child Abuse Prevention Month

Every April Catholic parishes and schools across the U.S. participate in National Child Abuse Prevention Month. While dioceses work year-round to prevent abuse, during the month of April a special emphasis is placed on the importance of learning how to protect the vulnerable from this evil.

Safety for All

Every child deserves a safe environment. Ministry to children and young people is a privilege, not a right. The sexual abuse of minors is a crime and a grave sin. In accordance with diocesan policy, when a single act of sexual abuse is admitted or established, the offender is to be removed permanently from ministry. To help hold offenders accountable, report all abuse to local police authorities. You can also contact the diocesan victim assistance coordinator to make a report and seek outreach for the abused. These individuals are available to assist you in making a formal complaint of abuse to the diocese/eparchy, in arranging a personal meeting with the bishop or his representative, and for obtaining support for your specific needs.
