

Clergy Bulletin Letter

Dear St. Joseph Family,

A blessed and joyful Easter to you all. As it is with Christmas, Easter is not simply one day, but an entire season that extends until Pentecost Sunday on May 23rd. During this time, we celebrate Jesus' rising from the grave on Easter Sunday, as well as the period of time he remained with the early Church community until His Ascension 40 days after the Resurrection. I imagine those were incredible days for the Apostles, our Blessed Mother, and many others who encountered the risen Lord



as he continued to teach and heal. The Church offers us this extended period of time in order to draw us into this experience of remaining with Jesus so that He can teach and heal us as well.

In his homily on the Easter Vigil, Pope Francis mentioned that Easter is about accepting the invitation of Jesus to go to Galilee to meet Him Who goes before us and waits for us there. It is in "Galilee", the place where the encounter with Jesus first began, that, despite our failures and defeats, we can begin anew. It is there that we will be amazed by our Lord's infinite love. Returning to Galilee, Pope Francis also said, is a call to move away from the tomb, to move away from living in the past, and of thinking that Jesus is only a distant memory. Returning to Galilee is a signal that our faith must always be on the road, journeying forward, with an openness to being continually surprised by God.

How do we do this? How do we return to our own Galilee? What can we do, practically, during this period to set it apart, to savor it, to be surprised by God, so that it doesn't simply become a holiday on the calendar that comes and goes, but a *season* that informs the entirety of our lives? I would like to recommend three things. Prayer, Reconciliation and Service.

First, prayer. Not to quote Pope Francis too much, but in his General Audience on Wednesday, he remarked that prayer is the breath of our faith; without prayer, our faith cannot survive. Looking to Luke's Gospel, the Pope turned to Jesus' question, "when the Son of Man comes, will he find faith on earth?" For so many of us, life can become consumed with organizational success. But Jesus is not asking for this, He is asking for faith, an entrustment of our lives to Him, which is nourished in prayer. Some of us may find prayer difficult. "How do I pray?" we ask. I always recommend coming to church outside of Mass and sitting in God's presence. Five minutes at a time, then increase. Be silent and open your heart to hear God speak and to receive His love. Prayer is precisely this, not so much us speaking many words, but an exchange of love between God and us.

Second, Reconciliation. Last week we celebrated Divine Mercy Sunday. Besides reception of the Eucharist, there is no greater exchange of love that we can regularly participate in than the celebration of the Sacrament of Reconciliation. It is there that we say "yes" to leaving our own tombs behind to begin a new life. Has it been a while since you've been to Confession? Don't be afraid or embarrassed. As I said in my homily on Sunday, nothing means more to me, or any priest for that matter, than welcoming home a prodigal son or daughter, because we've been there ourselves.

Lastly, service. Jesus came to serve, that was His mission, to serve us with his dying and rising, and this was the mission He gave to His Apostles and us. And serving is not a burden. It is what flows naturally from the person who has been reborn and set free by God's mercy. Service is a way for us to experience and prolong the message and dynamism of Easter. Each time we encounter someone in need and share with them what we have received, the Resurrection of Jesus is manifested anew in our world.

I am grateful to God for you and for this community that has shown me fervent witnesses to the power of prayer, reconciliation and service. Continue to live these things and you will inspire many more to love Jesus and be loved by Him.
