# MEDICAL TRIP



## Join Us!

Medical trip participants will partner with a local physician and healthcare providers to offer treatment in the Maños De Cristo medical clinic in city of Ocosingo in Chiapas, Mexico among indigenous Tzeltal people where access to medical care is lacking.

Be a part of the first Medical Trip Group to return since the start of the pandemic.

A few non-medical people are welcome , but we need to make sure there is enough medical people first.

## Details

**Dates:** Saturday July 22 through Sunday July 30, 2023.

Travel the 22nd; get ready at the clinic on 23; Monday through Friday receive patients; tourist day on Saturday the 29 and then fly home on the 30th.

**Cost:** Airfare (as of 2/23 about \$1,000 for NJ to Chiapas), room+ground transportation+most meals \$500, travel insurance about \$100. Pocket money for souvenirs, meals while traveling, luggage fee.

**Where will we Stay?** While in Ocosingo we will stay at a large, private residence in the market district of the city. Last night in a hotel in San Cristobal (Spanish colonial style tourist city).

## Background Information

This trip is facilitated by Hebron USA, a faith-based humanitarian nonprofit organization which works hand in hand with the indigenous peoples of Southern Mexico. Americans and Mexicans serve side-by-side in pursuit of the mission of serving Christ through serving one another. Their action areas include:

- Medical and Dental Services
- Mission Trip Organization and Support
- Education and Leadership Development
- Missionary Support

They operate on the philosophy of serving *with* as opposed to providing *for*. Hebron USA works closely with their sister organization in Chiapas.
