Who can enter? The contest is open to students in Kindergarten through Grade 12 who are current residents of the State of Hawaii. Students may only enter one division.

What must an entry include? An entry must identify an existing problem in Hawaii and offer a thoughtful solution to the problem. How will students know if they won? Award winners will be contacted through their schools/teachers and invited to the awards program in February 2020.
