



# VIDEO COMPETITION

## for HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS

High school students are invited to submit a 2-3 minute video that addresses the theme: "Hawai'i Aquaculture: A Tradition of Navigating with Innovation, Technology, and Culture."

Videos can address various aspects of aquaculture within the theme above. Questions addressed could include, but are not limited to: What is the tradition of aquaculture in Hawai'i?; How does aquaculture contribute to a sustainable food supply in Hawai'i?; What role does science play in aquaculture?; What role does indigenous or local knowledge play in aquaculture in Hawai'i?; How does the tradition of aquaculture in Hawai'i exemplify indigenous science? The competition accepts videos of any genre including documentaries, animation, short interview, and historical among other film genres.
