USDA's AgDiscovery is an outreach program that helps teenagers learn about careers in plant and animal sciences, wildlife management, and agribusiness. This 2-week summer program is for high school students, grades 9-11 upon application. Students chosen to participate in AgDiscovery will live on a college campus and learn about agriculture from university professors, scientists, and agriculture professionals who work for the private sector and for the U.S. Government in a variety of fields. Students will also gain experience through hands-on labs, workshops, field trips, and other group/team-building activities. This is the 9th year that an AgDiscovery program is being offered in Hawai'i!

All costs, except transportation to and from the program, are covered by the AgDiscovery program.

The University of Hawai'i is offering an AgDiscovery program at its Mānoa campus this summer.

USDA/APHIS' Plant Protection and Quarantine, Veterinary Services, Biotechnology Regulatory Services, and Wildlife Services units are co-sponsoring this program with the University of Hawai'i.
