HISTORY OF ST. PAUL

On October 16, 1960, 38 families signed the charter of St. Paul Evangelical Lutheran Church, and our church came into being at a special organizational service held that morning in the Old Saybrook Theater. This culminated several years of missionary work by the Rev. Paul Johnson, Seminarian Ken Johnson, and the Rev. Byron Swanson.

For two years the congregation rented the Masonic Temple for Sunday worship. Rotating "set-up" crews arrived early to put up the altar and arrange chairs, and stayed after to move everything out. All other meetings were necessarily held in homes. Members willingly opened their houses to council meetings, choir rehearsals, LCW meetings, church suppers and Lenten services. It was a blessing to eventually build a church, but there was much to be said for the closeness that existed when we were all regular visitors in each other's homes.

In the fall of 1961, Pastor Stephen B. Johnson became the first full time pastor of St. Paul. He was with us for five years. It was during his ministry that the present church was built in 1963 and the congregation doubled its membership. In 1966 Pastor Johnson left to assume the chaplaincy of Upsala College.

In the summer of 1966, the Rev. Norman E. Sutterlin accepted our call. Pastor Sutterlin's ministry was one of love, and in his care the parish flourished. We celebrated our tenth anniversary as a vital, growing congregation. In September of 1973, the congregation was stunned by the news that Pastor Sutterlin had suffered a heart attack. It was not God's will that he should return to us. He suffered two more heart attacks and on March 7, 1974, he died. The congregation mourned him deeply, and he will always be a living, loving memory in our hearts.

In September, 1974, the Rev. Elwood O. Semmel became our pastor until his resignation became effective at the end of 1977.

In September 1978, the Rev. Rolf L. Hedberg accepted our call and was installed that December as the fourth pastor of St. Paul. Pastor Hedberg was with us for nine years during which time he married and had two children. Mortgages were retired on both the church and the parsonage, and once again dreams of a new church began surfacing.

In February of 1988 Pastor Hedberg left to accept a new call and the congregation settled into a program of self-analysis to prepare us for calling a new pastor. Self-analysis provided the congregation with a view of what we needed in a new pastor and what we, as a congregation, needed to be. Pastor Paul E. Lutz was the candidate we decided would best meet our needs and the call was issued and accepted.

In December of 1988, Pastor Paul Lutz became the fifth pastor of St. Paul. One year into his ministry has proven the wisdom of our call. All systems are "go" and the congregation is growing both in ministry and numbers. We have added sixteen new families for a total of forty additional members. We are a caring community in the service of Christ, our Lord, and we invite all to share with us in worship and service.
