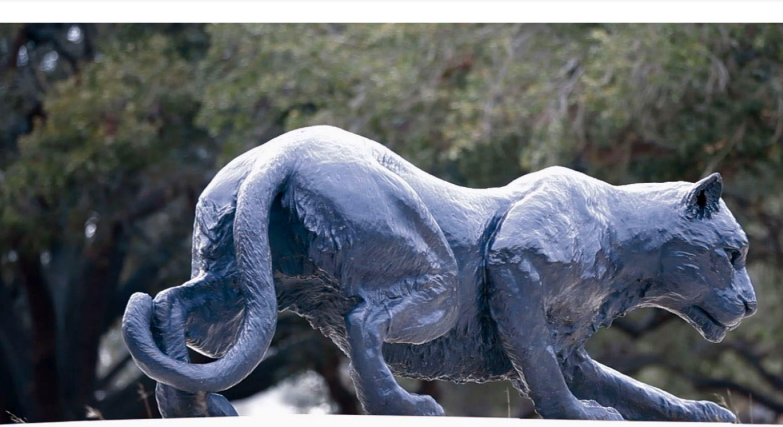

INTERNSHIP

Objectives:

The Capitol Hill Internship Program is designed to provide access to:

- Understand the policy-making process and how policy affects society.
- Develop skills and competencies in political professions, plus an opportunity to explore career interests and form networks.
- Apply academic coursework knowledge and examine firsthand how theories learned in the classroom impact society and the world.

Interns will also provide valuable assistance to their hosting Congressional Office.

Academics:

Stay on track for graduation:

- Interns are required to enroll in POSC 4153* – Internship in Political Science
- Students may also enroll in POSC 4993 or 4143 – Legislative Process Independent Study or select from eight core, support area, or major requirements courses offered online. Enrollment in more than six (6) cumulative hours requires Faculty Advisor approval

** Enrollment in POSC 4153 will classify the student as full-time with the Registrar's office.*

Note that the criteria for a full-time classification for Financial Aid is a separate determination.

Benefits:

Experience Washington D.C., one of the most vibrant and historical cities in the world.

The Program offers:

- Summer, Fall and Spring term internships
- Stipends to help defray travel and living expenses
- Housing provided at no cost to the intern

Who May Apply:

- U.S. Citizens and at least 18 years of age
- Full-time degree-seeking students at PVAMU
- Students who will have completed a minimum of 60 semester hours coursework at PVAMU and have a 3.0 or higher GPA (3.3 or higher in major)
- Students with a declared Political Science major or minor desired; other majors may also qualify

How to Apply:

- A resume must also be submitted
- Applicants will be interviewed by Faculty/Staff and/or the Hosting Congressional Office

How to Give:


