Class Descriptions

English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL)

ESOL Level: 1-6

In-person and online options

Our ESOL core classes focus on the ability to listen, speak, read, write, use math, think critically and creatively, and use technology to navigate our lives. Each class is content- or theme-based, and skills are taught in context. Each class also works towards a final, integrated-skills project.

Citizenship Class

ESOL Level: 2-4

Online

This year-long content-based ESOL course prepares students to pass the US naturalization exam. Regular reading lessons develop literacy skills and focus on the civics and history content of the 100 questions. Students also practice sentence level dictation and sight word spelling. Listening and speaking prepares students to participate in academic discussions, presentations, and formal interview situations. Citizenship students will need to do an intake, sign an information sharing consent form, share a copy of their green card, and share a copy of benefits or income evidence.

Beginning Computer Class

ESOL Level: 2+ and ABE Level: 1-6

In-person

This class prepares beginners with little or no computer experience, as well as students interested in expanding their digital literacy, with transferable computer skills necessary for their personal, work and educational lives. This class is suitable for any English level or literacy level. Basic Computer Skills Class will focus on basic student email, Google Classroom, Book Widgets, and Zoom skills that are needed for success in Literacy Source classes. Each quarter curriculum will remain largely the same with the expectation that returning students will be reviewing or practicing these core digital literacy skills for use in concurrent and future classes. Students must be able to read sight words, have taken at least 1 quarter of ESOL 1 or be concurrently enrolled in ESOL 1 or higher to enroll in class.

Ready to Work

ESOL Level: 3-4

Hybrid- In-person Monday/Wednesday, Online Tuesday/Thursday

Ready to Work is a job-skills ESOL class that teaches reading, writing, listening, speaking, math and digital literacy in workplace contexts. The class is 4 days per week and has a required independent work component. Employment case management support is provided for participants. Students must live in the city of Seattle and be interested in finding a new or better job. In addition to the Literacy Source hosted class, this class is also offered at ACRS and Neighborhood House High Point.

Math Lab

Online

In GED Math Lab, students are able to work independently, with tutor support, on their next specific math goals. Students can practice any level of math they need to improve their lives or work toward a credential from addition to pre-calc.

Academic English (ABE Level: 4-6 and ESOL Level: 6)

Online

This class focuses on developing writing, reading, and reasoning skills in the context of reading across three main disciplines- social studies, science, and language arts. Each quarter covers one subject. The class offers two streams of learning:

Life Skills

- *academic reading*
- *college preparation*
- *language skills for career development*

GED Skills

- *GED test practice*
- *GED test strategies*
- *GED Academy (independent learning)*

Conversation (ESOL Level: 2-6)

In-person only

In whole-class and small-groups, students practice conversation around a variety of daily life topics. Class focuses on speaking and listening skills.

Grammar Lab (ESOL 4-6, ABE 3-6)

Online only

In the grammar lab, students will practice sentence-level grammar for speaking and writing, focusing on control of simple, compound, and complex sentences. Online only.

Workplace English for Port Jobs Careers (Construction) (ESOL 3-5)

Online with required in-person field trip

In this pre-apprenticeship English class students will learn about apprenticeships in construction and how to apply for them. This is an online class with an independent work component and a required in-person field trip. Assistance in applying for apprenticeship programs will be provided. Students must be interested in working in this field.

ESOL 5: Bridge to College (ESOL 5-6)

Online

This class will prepare students to enter college programs by providing intensive instruction in academic reading and writing skills. Students will read, write, and discuss topics related to education and pathway planning. This class is for students that have exited level 4, but may lack the strong academic skills needed to succeed in an I-BEST setting or advanced English class in a college setting. The class will be taught on Canvas.

Democracy Voucher Student Leaders Workshop (ESOL 3-6, ABE)

Online

Student Leaders will learn about the City of Seattle's Democracy Voucher program and plan service-learning projects to educate their communities about how to participate in the Democracy Voucher Program. Students will implement their projects independently outside of class time. A stipend will be paid for attending class sessions, completing homework tasks and project work.

Introduction to Healthcare Jobs (ESOL 4-5)

Online

In this class, students will learn about multiple entry-level health care careers and how to access them. Classes will include guest speakers from different health care areas and positions as well as information about current in-demand health care jobs. This class is an online class with no homework and is only suitable for students interested in working in a healthcare field. Class is 5 sessions only on Fridays May 8 - April 5.

Tutoring

In-person and online

Tutoring is offered to support students enrolled in our ESOL, GED, and Citizenship classes. Tutoring is 1-2 times a week for as little as 90 minutes and up to 2 hours long.

Additional Tutoring Programs:

Adult Foundational Skills Tutoring (ABE Level: 1-3)

In-person or Online

Work 1:1 with a tutor for reading, writing, math, or digital skills/computers. Three hours/week. Co-enrollment in another Literacy Source class is not required for this tutoring program.

Citizenship Tutoring (ESOL 2-4)

In-person or Online

Students may be placed with a citizenship tutor without being enrolled in another Literacy Source class if they are low income, within one year of being able to apply and if they are not a good fit for the evening online class.
