Your child tests positive for COVID-19

## IF

Someone in your child's household tests positive for COVID-19

## IF

Someone your child has been in "close contact" with tests positive for COVID-19

## THEN

Your student's classroom teacher will provide remote instruction to your child via Canvas and Seesaw for days school is in session over the course of at least 10 days. Additionally, your child should not attend any in person co-curriculars during this time. The last day prior to your child's return to on campus instruction, your child must by symptom-free.

## THEN

Your student's classroom teacher will provide remote instruction to your child via Canvas and Seesaw during the time any members of the household that test positive are isolating plus an additional fourteen calendar days after the infected member/s of the household are released from isolation. This assumes the child continues to be in direct, close contact with the household member while they are infectious. Additionally, your child should not attend any in person co-curriculars during this time. ${ }^{* *}$ If the COVID-19 positive household member is able to isolate separately (defined as separte living, eating and sleeping space) from the child, the child would follow the guidelines for "close contacts." This also assumes your child does not develop symptoms during the quarantine period.

## THEN

Your student's classroom teacher will provide remote instruction to your child via Canvas and Seesaw for days school is in session over the course of 10 days. Additionally your child should not attend any in person co-curriculars during this time. If your child is symptomfree throughout this time your child can return to on campus instruction. This assumes your child does not develop symptoms during the quarantine period.

## AT LEAST

Close contact is defined as: being within approximately 6 feet of a COVID-19 case (someone who has tested positive for COVID19) for a combined 15 minutes or more through a day ( 24 hours), or direct physical contact with a COVID-19 case (someone who has tested positive for COVID-19).
