**A Note from Rabbi Shafner:** There is a difference of opinion about the recitation of the 13 Midot Harachamim (Divine attributes) by an individual praying without a minyan. Some hold that one should not say from “El Melech Yoshev” through “Unichaltanu” without a minyan. Others hold that this may be said except for the sentence “Hashem, Hashem, El Rachum V’chanun” which may not be said when praying alone. A third opinion is that one may say the entire paragraph with “Hashem, Hashem” but that line must be said only with the Torah tune, as if one is reading it as a verse rather than praying it. I believe it is best to follow the first opinion and not say the entire paragraph from “El Melech Yoshev” through “Unichaltanu” when praying at home. The document below follows this opinion.
