#### The Nicene Creed

**The next Racial Justice Discussion Group will be Thursday, September 23; 6:30 p.m.** Please join us as we turn our attention to systemic injustice in the art world. Who gets to determine which art is/is not "good"? How does the role of the person who "discovers" an outsider artist influence that artist's work, and who does such a discovery really serve? Who gets to decide what an "outsider" artist is? Which plays are produced and showcased in the most prominent theatrical venues? Why? Who gets to perform them? Whose works are not being seen and how can that be changed?

We will read and discuss two articles from the online art publication Hyperallergic. The first is about the recent production of William Shakespeare's Merry Wives of Windsor with an all Black cast at the Public Theater in Central Park. The second is an article from 2018 about the work of Bill Traylor, a 19th century outsider artist who was discovered by a white collector in the late 1930s. Both articles raise thorny questions about influence, point of view, and the power structures underlying artistic systems.
