1. What drew you to Ascension?

2. What do you see as Ascension’s greatest strengths?

I still have a lot to learn about Ascension. But I see her greatest strengths as her ministry, her music, and her history. There are unique aspects about each of these areas that are compelling to me, and I feel could be leveraged to have a greater impact on the local community.
