Our relationship with the area affected by the earthquake goes back to 2015. That's when the sanctuary in Bondeau, pictured above, was consecrated for Good Samaritan Episcopal Church in Bondeau.

Martel is 30 minutes west of Bondeau. When people from Martel saw the new church in Bondeau, they approached Fr. Phanord about helping them start a school and church.

We met in Madame Nelson's shady yard in 2016. We dreamed of creating a sustainable partnership together, one that didn't depend on Americans donating money indefinitely. We talked about developing economic opportunities for the community.

St. Luke's Episcopal Church and School opened in Martel in 2017, thanks to a building grant from United Thank Offering. Fourteen Episcopal churches have joined our

effort. Since then we have supported the teacher salaries for the church, providing education for nearly 100 students grades pre-K through 6.

Our dream of economic self sufficiency in Martel hasn't happened yet. But we have made some lovely relationships. Together we are building the Body of Christ. Every Sunday, lay leaders travel from Bondeau to Martel to lead worship. Good Samaritan Episcopal Church in Bondeau is evangelizing St. Luke's in Martel. As foreigners, we are not proselytizing,

but rather supporting the work that Fr. Phanord and his lay leaders are doing. We believe God has called us to be there in a ministry of presence.
