



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LIGHTING OF THE ADVENT CANDLE 1

The first candle symbolizes **HOPE** and is called the "Prophet's Candle." The prophets of the Old Testament, especially Isaiah, waited in hope for the Messiah's arrival.

Creator God, you are the light of the world! We long for your Presence to be with us as Your plan of redemption and grace for this broken world is realized. Give us hearts that see Your beauty and wait in HOPE for You to make all things good and new again.

[LIGHT the Prophet's Candle of HOPE!]

May Your light and love shine brightly in our hearts, spreading HOPE, Faith, Joy, and Peace to those around us! AMEN!

PRAYER OF THE DAY *The presiding minister free floats the prayer of the day.*

Let us pray. *A brief silence is kept before the prayer.*

Stir up your power, Lord Christ, and come. We need your HOPE!...

---By your merciful protection awaken us to the threatening dangers of our sins, and keep us blameless until the coming of your new day, for you live and reign with the Father and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. **Amen.**

WORD God speaks to us in scripture reading, preaching, and song

A reading from Isaiah Read by Worship Asst.

This lament comes from a people who have had their hopes shattered. The visions of a rebuilt Jerusalem and a renewed people of God, spoken of in Isaiah 40–55, have not been realized. Instead, the people experience ruin, conflict, and famine. This lament calls God to account—to be the God who has brought deliverance in the past.
