11/19 12:30pm-3:30pm Planning Supportive Environments for Children and Families (Pt. 4 of 4) Participants will examine ways in which to plan supportive environments for diverse children and their families. Emphasis will be place on the importance of enlisting and including families in the process. K3C231.
