



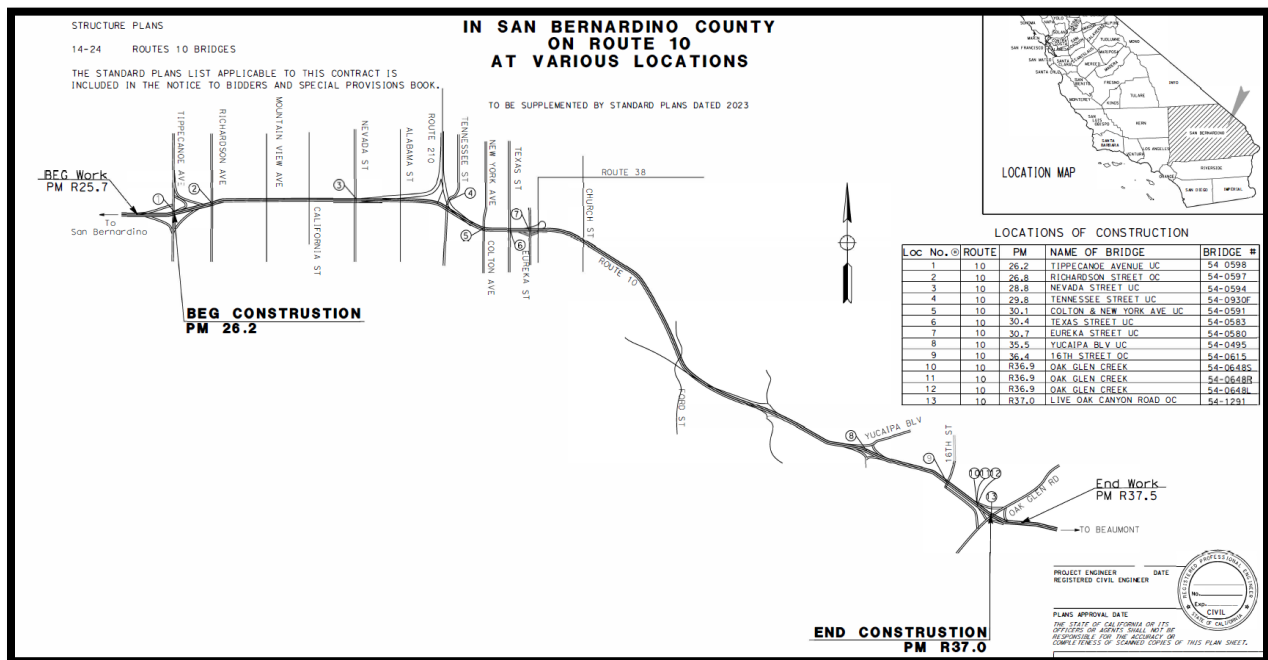

Preventative Maintenance on Thirteen Bridges Work Began on Interstate 10 between Loma Linda and Yucaipa Mid 2026

SAN BERNARDINO – Caltrans will continue to work on a \$4.6 million preventative maintenance on thirteen bridges project at Interstate 10 (I-10). This work is funded through Senate Bill (SB) 1, the Road Repair and Accountability Act of 2017.



Preventative maintenance will improve bridge road conditions and safety by strengthening the bridge travelway with new polyester concrete overlay, repairing unsound concretes, replacing joint seals, upgrading approach concrete slabs, furnishing with new HMA, replacing road signs, and installing new pavement markings along with new traffic stripes. These elements aim to enhance safe accessibility and produce a smoother surface for all roadway users.

Constructions signs have been placed in the project zone to make the traveling public aware of the crews in the area. Operations will be on Interstate 10 between Loma Linda

and Yucaipa. It is expected to be completed by Spring 2027. All work schedule and timelines are dependent on weather conditions and the availability of materials.

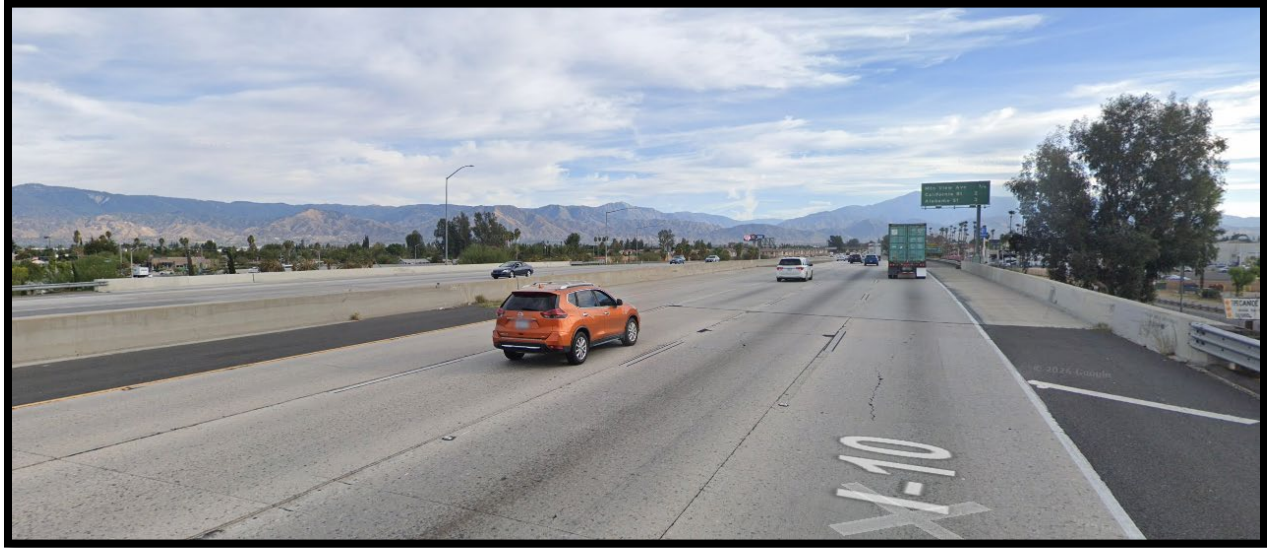


Figure 1 I-10 Bridge at Tippecanoe Ave

Week of June 22nd Work Activities:

Construction crews will continue the work activities with multiple alternating lane closures, reverse control lane closures with flagging, freeway connector closures, ramp closures, and shoulder closures at both eastbound and westbound I-10 between Loma Linda and Yucaipa Monday (06/22) through Friday (06/26) from 8:00 p.m. to 6:00 a.m. The work activities will include surveying the bridge approach concrete slabs, performing bridge roadway stripe removal, locating unsound concrete, repairing unsound concrete, and applying methacrylate bridge deck treatment within the project zone on I-10 between Tippecanoe Ave and Live Oak Canyon Rd throughout the week. **Closures are dependent on contractors receiving proper materials for each job function. They can be changed or canceled at any time. Weather permitting.**

Work locations are as follows:

Westbound (WB) I-10 on-ramp and off-ramp closures

- Live Oak Canyon Rd off-ramp
- Yucaipa Blvd off-ramp
- Alabama St on-ramp

Eastbound (EB) I-10 on-ramp and off-ramp closures

- Tennessee St on-ramp

- Yucaipa Blvd off-ramp
- Live Oak Canyon Rd off-ramp
- California St on-ramp

Westbound (WB) I-10 connector closures

- WB I-10 to WB SR-210 connector closure may occur on Monday (06/22), Tuesday (06/23), Thursday (06/25), and Friday (06/26)

Eastbound (EB) I-10 connector closures

- EB SR-210 to EB I-10 connector closure may occur on Monday (06/22), Tuesday (06/23), and Friday (06/26)

I-10 overcrossing bridge/surface street with reverse control lane closure with flagging operations

- 16th St
- Richardson Ave

Westbound (WB) and Eastbound (EB) I-10 with alternating lane closures

- I-10 mainline bridge over Eureka St
- I-10 mainline bridge over Colton Ave and New York St
- I-10 mainline bridge over Tennessee St
- I-10 mainline bridge over Tippecanoe Ave
- I-10 mainline bridge over Nevada St

I-10 overcrossing bridges/surface street with alternating lane closures

- Live Oak Canyon Rd
- Yucaipa Blvd

What to Expect:

Expect traffic delays due to alternating lane closures, reverse control lane closures with flagging, freeway connector closures, ramp closures, and shoulder closures on both eastbound and westbound I-10 during construction. Approximate flagging wait times per side may take up to 20 minutes. Traffic cones and control devices will be in place to separate work areas from traffic. Signage will be placed on the state route to alert drivers of upcoming work zones. Commuter, public transportation, and pedestrian access remain as work requires

temporary lane closures and shoulder closures at various points along the route. Plan-ahead and please be mindful of work area signage as law enforcement will enforce applicable laws and regulations. Please proceed cautiously as work vehicles and crews may move in and out of shoulder areas.
