

# CCP FAQs

## What is College Credit Plus (CCP)?

- State-wide program where students can earn college credit & high school credit at the same time. In other states, it is simply called “dual-enrollment”

## Who runs the College Credit Plus program?

- At Bishop Fenwick, Sabrina Snyder is the CCP coordinator. She works closely with the state and the CCP coordinators at each college. Mrs. Horn and Mrs. Weisbrod are also very knowledgeable about CCP and can answer most questions.

## Do I have to attend the informational/counseling meeting even though I was at last year’s meeting?

- Yes, the mandatory meeting is mandatory each year. Your student will not be permitted to take CCP courses without the student and parent attending the meeting.

## Who is allowed to take CCP classes?

- Any BFHS student who is accepted into a college’s CCP program may take CCP courses. A minimum GPA of 2.75 is required. Some CCP classes also have pre-requisites (English or Math high school courses earning at least a B grade or standardized test scores)
- CCP courses offered at BFHS are open to Juniors and Seniors
- Typically, the students taking CCP courses (at BFHS or online) are upperclassmen. There have been a few cases where freshmen or sophomores have taken CCP courses, but parents and students should be aware that these courses are college level courses with college level expectations for work and independence.

## Who pays for CCP courses?

- There is a process to apply for funding from the state so that the state pays some or all of the tuition cost of the CCP class. You continue to pay BFHS tuition.
- If you choose, you can self-pay for the college tuition. The price of this varies based on which college your student “takes” their CCP course through. Credits earned through Sinclair CCP are usually about \$45 per credit hours. Classes are typically 3-5 credit hours.

## How are CCP courses offered?

- At BFHS, taught by BFHS teachers who are also qualified to teach at the college level.
  - CCP Intro to Anthropology (11<sup>th</sup> & 12<sup>th</sup> grades)
  - CCP Intro to Education (11<sup>th</sup> & 12<sup>th</sup> grades)
  - CCP Chemistry I & CCP Chem II (11<sup>th</sup> & 12<sup>th</sup> grades)
  - CCP Composition I & CCP Composition II (12<sup>th</sup> grade)
  - CCP Anatomy & Physiology (12<sup>th</sup> grade)

- In-person on college campuses that have CCP programs (You must be on time for your Fenwick classes)
