I have recently (and only briefly) come up for air from all of the pending projects that are on the runway waiting for take-off here at the library. Don't ever let anyone tell you that librarians get to sit around and read the day away. In this little open window as one fiscal year ends and the next begins, I have had time to talk in a meaningful way with some of the members of our staff team to learn about their jobs and to learn about them. It has been one of my greatest joys in the past week or so to see a genuine enthusiasm and dedication to this library from everyone who has talked with me. I am very proud of them. And I am privileged to serve alongside them.

All of the staff members here have risen to meet tremendous challenges in the past couple of years. Throughout the pandemic, staff retirements, administrative upheaval, and the massive re-decoration project just completed, our folks have consistently done what was asked of them, handling almost unmanageable situations with grace and aplomb.

Do you know the story of the marble lions that have stood at the entrance to the New York Public Library's Beaux Arts building at Fifth Avenue and 42nd Street since 1911? During the Great Depression, Mayor Fiorella LaGuardia re-named the Lions, Patience and Fortitude, after the qualities he felt New Yorkers needed to get through the Depression. I have begun to feel that the NKFL staff guards our own North Kingstown Free Library as doggedly as Patience and Fortitude guard the NYPL.

I am confident that as we move into the fall in our newly re-decorated building and we begin to think about how we might expand and enhance our services, you will be excited about all that the library offers to you on a daily basis. Remember—it is the staff who makes it all happen. They care about serving all of you. They care about this library. And they care about public libraries in general. The NYPL website reminds us that their lions have been a witness to history "all while remaining a steadfast symbol for what the library represents: a source of strength and inspiration for all." 


