## Message from the Director—Libraries Change Lives

Years ago, *The American Scholar* published a cartoon of tombstones showing trends, tools, and institutions that would die off in the first half of the twenty-first century. It was based on Richard Watson's “extinction timeline” from his 2007 book: *Future Files: A History of the Next 50 Years*. The tombstone for 2019 was engraved with the word **Libraries**.

Fortunately for all of us—librarians and the beloved communities we serve—Watson was wrong! Here we are in 2023 and libraries are not extinct. Far from it. In fact, libraries are more important than ever.

The mission of the public library has always been to be “all things to all people.” Having been in existence in North America since the early 1700's, well before the American Revolution, the public library has had to be ever-changing in order to fulfill that mission. The mission of the NKFL is to meet “the changing and enduring cultural, educational, informational, recreational, and research needs of its users.” The operative words in our mission are: **changing and enduring**. Because we pivot when we have to; and we play the long game, the NKFL will always be a vital resource in our community.

If you have any doubt about the endurance and vitality of this library or the public library in general, I encourage you to read an article that appeared in *The New York Times* February 14, 2023 issue: “A Love Letter to Libraries, Long Overdue” by Elizabeth Egan and Erica Ackerbert. The *Times* sent photographers to seven states to document the public library in today's historical moment in the life of our nation. The pictures of children reading, writing, playing the guitar, listening to an outdoor storytime session, of homebound book deliveries, of a Senior Social Club, of a bookmobile, of a tool-lending library, of a bike repair clinic, of Braille books, of a volunteer audiobook narrator, of children chasing bubbles—all vibrant activities happening in public libraries across the country—give me hope that public libraries will still be here for the next generation. Egan and Ackerbert end their lovely paean to the public library with these words: “We all know that books connect us, that language has quiet power. To see the concentration, curiosity and peace on faces lit by words is to know—beyond a shadow of a doubt, in a time rife with shadows—that libraries are the beating hearts of our communities. What we borrow from them pales in comparison to what we keep. How often we pause to appreciate their bounty is up to us”.


## Movie Night


