1. \$5 1861 Demand Note - New York, Fr. 1. All Demand Notes are scarce with less than 500 pieces reported across all varieties. New York Demand Notes are encountered, but often in low grades and with many faults. This Series 4-position A example boasts bold colors and complete, even margins on both sides. Acquiring a Fr. 1 in any condition is an impressive feat; however, owning this bright, problem-free example is nothing shy of a trophy. PMG VF 25 \$8495



2. \$5 1861 Demand Note - Boston, Fr. 3. This Series 12 pp D example is an attractive payable at Boston note sporting white paper, dark inks, and a look that transcends its assigned grade. A trivial comment of 'restoration' appears on the holder for a tiny dot lightened in the margin that's nearly impossible to detect without magnification and various light sources. A collector will be proud to own this gorgeous greenback from America's first year of paper money. PMG VF 25 \$6450
3. \$5 1863 Legal Tender, Fr. 63a. Nearly identical face design as the DNs above. Bright paper and bold inks were the reasons this note was displayed in a former life. Comment of 'previously mounted' is appropriate, but not objectionable. The note retains exceptional eye-appeal. PMG Ch Unc 63 \$3450

4. \$5 1899 Silver Cert, Fr. 275 Chief. The bright paper, bold overprint and deep embossing stand out on this near-Gem \$5 Chief. Evenly proportioned margins and a graceful paper wave round out an appealing presentation on this pretty Napier-McClung Chief. PCGS Ch Unc 64 \$6995
5. \$5 1899 Silver Cert, Fr. 280m Chief. A comment of 'split' appears on this attractive Indian with pleasing paper and bold inks. A pair of pinholes observed, but not deemed not worthy of mention. PCGS VF 20 \$1150

6. \$5 1899 Silver Cert, Fr. 281, Chief. Final signature combination of this iconic design preserved in problem-free condition. A rare treat. PMG Ch Fine 15 \$1150



7. \$1 1896 SC, Fr. 224, Educational. History Instructing Youth. A classic American theme destined to highlight any collection. It is considered to be one of the most undervalued and certainly iconic designs in the entire spectrum of U.S. Paper Money. Just arrived and is too new for grading, but it's a textbook Ch XF. Grab it for less than its encapsulated siblings. Ch XF \$1895
8. \$1 1896 Fr. 224 Educational. A terrific opportunity to secure a pleasing and iconic note with a few minor spots and terrific eye-appeal. Ch VF... \$1650
9. \$1 1896 Fr. 225, Educational. A cheap chance to secure a comment-free example of a must-have design. PMG VG 8 \$375



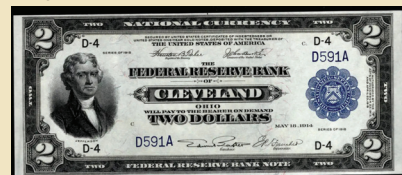
10. \$2 1896 SC, Fr. 248, Educational. Science Presenting Steam + Electricity to Commerce + Manufacture. A stunning example of an Educational deuce that offers the iconic allegory. The paper is bright, the inks are bold, and there's not much to say that the grade doesn't...except this is cheap. PCGS Gem 65PPQ \$12,950
11. \$2 1896 Fr. 247 Educational. There aren't many VF notes that face up as AU, but this is one of them leaving a seemingly perfect display of the central allegorical image. PCGS VF 30 \$3695
12. \$2 1896 Fr. 247 Educational. Brighter paper and bolder inks than above. We just bought a small group. Choose your favorite online or call to order. Ch VF \$3495



13. \$5 1896 SC, Fr. 268, Educational. Electricity as the Dominant Force in the World. A scarce survivor without problems and pleasing eye-appeal. New + Cheap. Very Fine \$4495
14. \$5 1896 SC, Fr. 269, Educational. Iconic and highly sought with pleasing eye-appeal and a small repaired split off the bottom margin. Inks are bold, paper is complete, and price is very attractive compared to recent sales. PCGS VF 25, det \$4295
15. \$5 1896 Fr. 270 Educational. An impressive offering of an elusive Lyons-Roberts with a few scattered PHs but overall nice look. A PMG VF 25 with "rust, rust stains, and tears" sold for \$4636 in a Heritage sale May 2026. This is priced to sell. VF \$3495



16. \$20 1891 Treasury Note, Fr. 375, Marshall. This scarce note bears the portrait of John Marshall who was Chief Justice of the U.S. Supreme Court from 1801 until his death in 1835. This offering is a nicely margined note with bright paper and very bold ink colors. PMG mentions a minor restoration, but nothing is readily apparent even after close scrutiny. PMG Ch Unc 63 \$5450
17. \$5 1875 Legal, Fr. 68 Woodchopper. A well-preserved and quite colorful example of this early Woodchopper note that's always in-demand, but rarely available. From a known run of high-grades with embossing visible through the holder. PMG Ch Unc 63 \$2795
18. \$5 1880 LT, Fr. Woodchopper. Blue serials + large red seal. Fully-original with bright paper, even margins, bold inks. Ch XF+ \$1195



19. \$2 1918 FRBN Fr. 757 Battleship - Cleveland. A stunning and iconic deuce with a low 3 Digit Serial # D591A as the cherry on top of this seemingly Super Battleship. PCGS Gem 66PPQ \$4995
20. \$2 1918 FRBN, Fr. 750 Battleship - New York. Faces up like a Gem with terrific eye-appeal. PCGS Ch Unc 63 \$2795



21. \$100 1891 TN, Fr. 378, Rarer the WATERMELON - Open Back \$100. Nearly 3 times scarcer than its iconic 1890 Watermelon predecessor. Only 13pcs known; 5 of which are locked in institutions. Professional restoration is confined to the margin and enhances the overall aesthetics of this rarity which is 1 of only 8 available to collectors. The highest grade known of the few Fr. 378s is a VF 35 which last sold just shy of \$300k nearly a decade ago. The most recent sale was a VF 25 with noticeable restorations that brought roughly \$170k in 2023. High-res images of both sides available online. PMG Fine 12 \$99,500. Interest-free terms available.
