

FALL IN LOVE WITH COLLECTING PAPER MONEY



1. \$10,000 1900 Gold Cert, Fr. 1225h. **Ten Thousand.** The inks remain bold and there's a large amount of embossing on the unprinted back. The usual roulette cancel for this Friedberg number is present with a "9 14 (19)16." date. This example was likely a survivor of the five alarm fire that broke out in the Washington, D.C. "Old Post Office" on December 13, 1935 that was tossed out the window before the heat and water could damage this note. Firefighters tossed these notes, along with other combustible material, from the windows of a large filing room on the sixth floor so that they would not feed the conflagration. Lucky onlookers on the street below were able to pick the notes up and spirit them away. Being unredeemable, they are not an obligation of the United States. The paper is bright, the margins are even, and the note would make any Gem collector proud to own. PCGS Ch Unc 64..... \$8450

2. \$10,000 1900 Gold Cert, Fr. 1225c **Ten Thousand.** Acquiring any ten thousand dollar gold cert is an impressive feat; however, there are nearly 300 opportunities to own a Fr. 1225h while only about 35 pieces are reported on this much tougher Fr. 1225c with Vernon-Treat sigs. An exceptionally clean XF note with paper originality that hails from a tougher Friedberg number for this unredeemable note. Fr. 1225c is often found payable to a national bank. In this case it is the Farmers & Mechanics National Bank of Philadelphia. The note does have the usual hole punch cancels, as that was the fate that awaited all examples of this design with the Vernon-Treat Treasury signature combination along with the comment of 'stains' as a poignant reminder of the time this spent in a blazing fire before being doused by fire hoses and saved and preserved for collectors to appreciate. 3. \$10,000 1900 Gold Cert, Fr. 1225h **Ten Thousand.** As these can quickly get out of reach in higher grades and are seldom available in both attractive and affordable Fine, we're beyond excited to have just picked up this large size gold certificate ultra-high denomination. Hardly uncommon for the type or the grade, this note has a few comments on the back which mention some minor rust, pieces missing, and lacquer on this survival from the 1935 postal fire. Despite a few grade-consistent flaws, this is an exciting opportunity to secure a tough and 'must have' note without having to spend the \$5k+ pricetag that's usually found on these notes. 4. \$50 1882 Gold Cert, Fr. 1197 **Department Series - Silas Wright.** An exceptional note preserved with impeccable eye-appeal. PMG has graded only five pieces above the AU level. This exceptionally well margined example has retained its full colors on both front and back, with a comment of minor restoration that must have only been visible prior to encapsulation. This note has a look that far exceeds its technical grade. PMG Ch VF 35..... \$7250

5. \$50 1882 Gold Cert, Fr. 1197 **Department Series - Silas Wright.** A pleasing example of an always in-demand note that has retained pleasing color on both sides. A small sealed tear is responsible for the comment of 'repaired' on the back. There aren't many opportunities to secure an attractive example of this note without breaking the bank. 6. \$2 1918 FRBN, Fr. 757 **Cleveland.** A handsome three digit deuce with terrific color and bold original embossing, this well centered piece displays low serial D591A. PCGS Gem Unc 66PPQ \$4995

7. \$2 1918 FRBN, Fr. 759 **Cleveland.** The note presents Unc with a faint center bend detectable during thorough exam. Great look! PMG Abt Unc 50..... \$2350

8. \$2 1918 FRBN, Fr. 752 **New York.** This iconic note faces up like a Gem with balanced margins and terrific eye-appeal! PMG Ch Unc 63 \$2795

9. \$2 1918 FRBN, Fr. 750 **New York.** Same great look as above. PCGS Ch Unc 63..... \$2795


10. \$2 1918 FRBN, Fr. 752 **New York.** This is the nicest 30 we've ever seen. Congrats to the collector that scores this beauty. PCGS VF 30 \$1595

11. \$2 1918 FRBN, Fr. 751 **New York.** Cheap, raw, and iconic! VF..... \$795

12. \$2 1918 FRBN, Fr. 762 **Atlanta.** Terrific eye appeal, bright paper, a trophy note! PCGS VF 30 \$1795

13. \$2 1918 FRBN, Fr. 774 **Kansas City.** An affordable + problem-free example of a must-have design. PMG Fine 12..... \$550

14. \$2 1918 FRBN, Fr. 767 **Chicago.** Bright + beautiful Battleship deuce. PMG Ch VF 35 \$1450



15. \$10 1880 Silver Cert, Fr. 289 **Robert Morris - Black Back.** This beauty is part of the small hoard broken up decades ago that has supplied collectors with the only known Unc examples of this Fr. #. It displays all of the attributes that one would hope for from a note in this grade, with excellent print quality and plenty of eye appeal. This exact note previously realized \$18,800 in a Heritage sale. We're thrilled to pass it along for considerably less. PMG Ch Unc 63 \$15,950

16. \$5 1923 Silver Cert, Fr. 282 **Porthole.** An iconic design that's readily available in VF, but to acquire a note with this presentation requires patience and persistence. We're thrilled to offer this trophy to an eager collector. PCGS Ch Unc 63 \$5450

17. \$5 1923 Silver Cert, Fr. 282 **Porthole.** Attractive + problem-free. PCGS VF 25 \$1750

18. \$2 1899 Silver Cert, Fr. 252 **Mini-Porthole.** Well centered deuce with ample, even margins, and ideal face to back registration. Embossing of the blue serial numbers and treasury seal is also present. PCGS Ch New 63..... \$1750

19. \$2 1899 Silver Cert, Fr. 256* **Mini-Porthole STAR.** More than 2500 regular issue notes remain available; with only roughly 65 stars, placing this in the top 3% for the Fr. #. A professionally sealed tear is responsible for the 'minor repairs' on back, but this note presents well-above the assigned grade with an eye-appeal deserving of a 35. PMG VF 25 \$2250



20. \$5 1899 Silver Cert, Fr. 275 **Chief.** The bright paper, bold overprint and deep embossing stand out on this near-Gem \$5 Chief. Evenly proportioned margins and a graceful paper wave round out an appealing presentation on this pretty Napier-McClung Chief. PCGS Ch Unc 64..... \$6995

21. \$5 1899 Silver Cert, Fr. 273 **Chief.** Fully original with blazing ink colors that faces up better than some slabbed Uncs on the market. This note easily earned the coveted EPQ. PMG Ch EF 45EPQ \$3995

22. \$5 1899 Silver Cert, Fr. 275 **Chief.** A charming and problem-free Napier-McClung Chief with a great look! PCGS VF 30 \$1795
