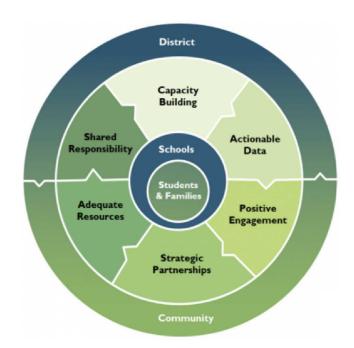

#### **Attendance Awareness Month!**



Improving student attendance requires a comprehensive, collaborative approach rooted in equity and support. A key component is capacity building—equipping district staff, school personnel, and community partners with professional development to implement data-driven, problem-solving strategies through a multi-tiered system of support and/or Student Assistance Program (SAP).

Actionable data plays a critical role by providing accurate, accessible, and timely insights into both the frequency and causes of absenteeism. These insights inform non-punitive prevention and intervention efforts tailored to student needs.

At the heart of this work is positive engagement, which fosters a culture of belonging and emphasizes why daily attendance matters across all grade levels.

Instead of using punitive measures, schools can build connections and motivation through a welcoming environment. Strategic partnerships with community organizations expand the range of supports available to address barriers to attendance, allowing for coordinated and personalized outreach to students and families.

Ensuring adequate resources is vital to create equitable opportunities for all students, regardless of their background. Finally, addressing chronic absenteeism requires shared responsibility.

Everyone—students, families, educators, community partners, and agencies—has a role. Systems must be designed to support cross-sector collaboration so that no single entity bears the burden alone, and every student has a pathway to success.

Within the 2024-2025 school year, Oak Hills Local School District and Delhi Middle School (DMS) shared a district wide goal to decrease chronic absenteeism.

At Delhi Middle School we focused on relationship building to drive our attendance focus. Within this school year DMS tried various creative strategies to encourage students and to educate students. staff and parents on the importance of attendance. We prioritized fun and praised our student voices on their thoughts, concerns, and understanding about attendance.

Our goal was to lower the Chronic Absentee rate from 34% to 30.6%.

By the end of the 2024-2025 school year DMS surpassed that goal with a rate of 24.6%!
