

RE: Attorney General's Mental Health Task Force

Dear Dr. Hogge:

I would like to extend an invitation to you to serve as a member of a mental health task force that I will be convening. The purpose of the task force will be to address a variety of issues including the availability and accessibility of mental health and drug/alcohol treatment services on the state and community levels, the opioid crisis, and the current state of the civil commitment laws, policies and procedures. Through our collaborative efforts, I believe we can effect positive changes in how mental health and treatment services are provided and accessed by the public.

Specifically, I anticipate that the work of the Mental Health Task Force will include: (1) the drafting of proposed legislation to make the commitment process easier for parents and those similarly situated to communicate with treatment professionals about their loved ones without written consent; (2) identifying methods to alleviate cost concerns for lower income families seeking services; (3) drafting standardized commitment orders for outpatient treatment after release and establishing an implementation plan for the courts; (4) creating procedures to address record sharing between drug and alcohol commitments and mental health commitments; and (5) establishing a state-wide prevention strategy to address Mississippi's growing opioid crisis.

I appreciate your consideration of this invitation to serve on the task force. If you are unable to serve, please feel free to designate a representative from your organization. If you would like to designate more than one person, please do so. I am attaching a list of agencies and/or groups we are inviting to participate and I am happy to add to this list should you identify an agency/group or specific person you would like to include.

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The first Mental Health Task Force meeting is scheduled for October 3, 2017, at 1:00 p.m. in the 13<sup>th</sup> floor press room of the Walter E. Sillers Building, 550 High Street, Jackson, MS. At the initial meeting, we will set our primary goals and objectives and establish sub-committees to focus on particular objectives. This format should insure that everyone's time and particular expertise is utilized as efficiently as possible. I know how busy all of you are and I appreciate your commitment to this process.
