Camping and a movie. What a combo!

A free, movie and an overnight family camp-out are on tap Friday, Sept. 16 at Pulaski Park. The Bloomfield Recreation Department invites residents (only) to register for one of 55 camp sites, see a PG-rated Disney adventure film with free popcorn, and gather 'round a campfire supervised by the Bloomfield Fire Department and FMB&A Local #19. (Bring s'mores supplies!)

Hot dogs, soda, water and other movie snacks will be available for \$1 per item. In the morning, Hot Bagels Abroad will serve juice and bagels.

Pre-registration begins Thursday, Sept. 1. Call (973) 743-9074, or go to the Civic Center (84 Broad Street) to sign up. Each camping group must include a responsible adult, age 18 or older. Campsites will be assigned on a first-come, first-served basis. Pre-registration is required to camp. Those attending the movie only need not pre-register and must exit the park after the movie.

On Friday, Sept. 23, a 25-foot inflatable movie screen and hi-def sound will enhance the outdoor screening of Steven Spielberg's 1985 hit, “The Goonies.” Park your car and your family (residents only) at Demarest School, 465 Broughton Avenue, to enjoy the second annual drive-in movie sponsored by the Bloomfield Recreation Department.

Tune in from your car radio and enjoy the outdoor movie system available thanks to a grant from Investors Bank. Free popcorn will be available while supplies last; other snacks and drinks will be \$1 each.

A reserved seating section will be provided for movies-goers who prefer to watch from a blanket or lawn chair. Recreation suggests all movie-goers bring blankets and lawn chairs in case the parking lot becomes full.

“The Goonies” is a 1985 PG-rated film about a band of pre-teens who live in the “Goon Docks” neighborhood of Astoria, Oregon. They attempt to save their homes from demolition, and in doing so, discover an old Spanish map that leads them on a search for long-lost treasure. A family of in-the-know crooks dogs them throughout.

Car Pre-registration for about 100 cars extends from Sept. 1 to 20. Reserved parking spots are limited and will be guaranteed only between 6:30 and 7:10 p.m. Afterward, the lot will be open to the public.
