Haunted Trail: A good scare, IF YOU DARE!

Zombies, Ghosts, Goblins, Clowns. You'll see them all on a spooky walk along the Bloomfield Morris Canal Greenway. On Friday, Oct. 21, from 6:30 to 10 p.m., the Bloomfield Recreation Department will host the first annual "Haunted Trail" event, for ages 10 and older (adult chaperones recommended for kids 10-13).

The walk starts behind Demarest School, winds through a wooded trail and ends at Morris Canal Park at Oak Tree Lane. Groups of up to 6 people will be guided along the trail. Long pants, comfortable shoes and flashlights are recommended. Every participant will receive a small flashlight and treat while supplies last.

Tickets are limited. The cost is \$2 per person, or \$10 fee/donation for groups of six. Rain Date: Thursday, Oct. 27.
