• **Virginia Cornue Home Garden** (143 Claremont Avenue, Montclair), 2 to 5 p.m. on May 6. See her tiny two-year-old front-yard garden, porch boxes, storage tub planters and recycled trellises.

Open May 20 only

- Luis Vieira Home Garden (94 Evergreen Avenue, Bloomfield), 11 a.m. to 4 p.m. The four-year-old garden includes multiple varieties of antique roses, butterfly-and bee-attracting flowers, plus edible greens that survived the winter: collards, Swiss chard and arugula.
- **Pulaski Park Community Garden** (corner of Mt. Vernon and Howard, Bloomfield), 9:30 to 11 a.m. The garden has 27 plots, each measuring 4x8 feet. Residents pay a seasonal gardening fee and grow whatever they like. Regular get-togethers and workshops create community within the garden.
