SOCIAL JUSTICE IN THE REAL WORLD

The focus of this course is on strategies for social justice and social change and on participants' own values, skills and future plans. We will engage in community-based learning (CBL) as a way to explore alternative meanings of social justice, theories and strategies for social change including dialogue, community organizing and development, social entrepreneurship, arts for social justice, public policy, scholar activism, philanthropy and more.

Students explore the roles of change agents through their site visits, the costs and benefits of careers in social activism and more traditional career environments.

Includes a community based learning (CBL) component, which will require about 3 hours of field site service outside of the class each week.
