



**2017 Tri-Campus Summit for Engaged Leadership**  
**Student Fellowship**

The Tri-Campus Summit for Engaged Leadership aims to bring together undergraduate students from across U-M's Ann Arbor, Dearborn, and Flint campuses to collaborate on issues of social justice, leadership, and community engagement. This year, the Michigan Tri-Campus Collaborative will support six undergraduate students who will serve as Fellows for the summit and other tri-campus initiatives. In order to promote a high-level of cross campus collaboration there will be two Fellows from each campus.

Fellows will help further the goals of the Michigan Tri-Campus Collaborative while they strengthen their leadership, outreach, project management, and interpersonal skills. The Fellows will participate in planning retreats, professional development workshops, and reflective activities in addition to the time spent doing both individual and group work to plan for the Summit for Engaged Leadership. The Fellowship experience will take place from **April 1, 2017- November 1, 2017**. The Tri-Campus Fellows will receive a stipend of \$750 which will be paid out in two installments: at the mid-point and conclusion of the Fellowship.

**Eligible Students Must:**

- ☐ Be an undergraduate enrolled in good academic standing in a degree program within one of the U-M campuses
- ☐ Show a demonstrated commitment to community engagement
- ☐ Be available for the full duration of the Fellowship, including **Saturday, October 21, 2017** (During summer months, fellowship is flexible, but requires the ability to communicate in person, video, and/or conference calls.)

**Fellows Will be Responsible For:**

- Program development and the logistical support including recruiting student and community speakers, managing the summit day-of needs, etc.
- Recruiting and guiding other students to support specific parts of the programmatic vision to maintain the importance of the student voice throughout this process.
- Assessing the impact of the event

The Tri-Campus Fellows will receive funding to work with one another and on their own campus for approximately 2-3 hours per week averaging \$10.00/hour. The time commitment will vary based on the needs of the project (i.e. more hours toward the beginning and end of the Fellowship to allow for appropriate project planning and implementation time.)
