

Rabbi Moshe Silberschein to “Visit”

Rabbi Moshe Silberschein will “virtually visit” Temple Beth Tzedek this Sunday, May 19th at 9:30 am. He is a candidate for the interim pulpit for 2019-20. The Rabbi Search Committee is eager for us to get to know him via a video conference Zoom meeting where he will do a teaching session, followed by a Q&A. Born in the Midwest, Rabbi Moshe Silberschein was educated at Columbia University, JTS and the Hebrew University. Ordained by JTS in 1981, he made Aliyah to Israel in 1982. Rabbi Silberschein teaches piyut, liturgy and classical rabbinic literature to undergraduate and graduate students of various religious backgrounds and countries of origin in Jerusalem and abroad. From 2009 – 2012 he served as the dean of the Schechter Rabbinical School of the Masorti Movement in Israel and is presently on the teaching faculties of the Jerusalem campus of Hebrew Union College and the Jerusalem University College on Mount Zion. Rabbi Silberschein has served as both rabbi and cantor in such diverse locales as Tokyo, Japan, Minneapolis, Minnesota, and most recently Savannah, Georgia as the interim rabbi at Congregation Agudath Achim from 2015 - 2016. He is married to Susan, a nurse at Hadassah Hospital and they have two sons - Aviad and Alon.
