

His book, Two Acres of Time (Columbia University Press, 2023) recounts the discoveries, interpretations, and challenges of that project.

From The Rabbi

What is Purim Katan? A Small Explanation

In addition to our robust suite of holidays in the Jewish calendar this month on the 14th day of Adar I or Friday February 23, we celebrate Purim Katan (minor Purim). Purim Katan is only celebrated during Jewish leap years which take place 7 out of every 19 years. The lunar year is slightly shorter than a solar year and in order for Passover, in the month of Nisan, to take place in the spring it is necessary to add an extra month to the calendar every 2-3 years. Because Nisan is considered the first month of the year Adar is the final month of the year, and a second Adar (Adar II) is added during a leap year to prevent Nisan from occurring too early.

In the book of Esther we are told to observe Purim in the month of Adar. The mitzvot that we are meant to observe during Purim are hearing the megillah, feasting, giving money to the poor (matanot l'evyonim), and gift packages of food to family and friends (mishloach manot). However no instructions are given about what to do when there are two months of Adar in a year!

The Mishnah in Tractate Megillah comes to tell us that if one read the Megillah in the first month of Adar and then there was a second month of Adar added to the calendar the Megillah should be read again. This implies that it is important to read the Megillah in Adar II. Today the calendar is set in advance and because we know which years will be leap years we always observe full Purim in Adar II. However on Purim Katan, like on Purim, we add joy to the day and refrain from fasting, eulogies and reciting Tachanun during daily prayer. The Shulkhan Arukh tells us it is meritorious to be in a more joyful mood and to even have a special meal on that day as a symbolic nod to the full Purim that we will be celebrating on the 14th of Adar II.

Generally, our rituals and customs for holidays are meant to prompt a feeling within us. For example lighting the menorah helps us remember the miracles that the Jewish people have witnessed, and is meant to evoke gratitude and hope. Eating matzah during Pesach is meant to remind us of the affliction of the Israelite slaves and prompts us to feel humble and empathetic toward those who are still not free. What is unique about Purim Katan is that we are supposed to feel joyful without a ritual to prompt us.

I call Purim Katan to our attention this year because the attacks in Israel on October 7, Shmini Atzeret/Simchat Torah, was a horrific start to our year and the losses have mounted since then. We do not look to erase what has happened or to ignore our genuine sadness and fear. However our calendar this year presents us an extra chance to remember the message of Purim: we can overcome our hateful enemies, and one day find cause for celebration. We need this extra joy and hope this year. On Purim Katan I encourage you to feast a little and to find small ways of adding joy to your day. Hopefully a little joy will go a long way, until we can fully celebrate Purim together next month. Purim Katan Sameach!

Many of us have already made a donation (\$20 minimum) to receive a dog tag necklace that says Bring Them Home. The tags are available in the office. While we pray that all the hostages will be returned to their loved ones soon, we hold a seat for Yosef. The proceeds for the tags are going to support the efforts of the hostage's families pleas for their safe release.

Get ready for the Super Bowl Shabbat dinner Friday February 9th, sponsored by the Youth Education Committee. Please note the change in schedule for that evening, dinner will be at 6 p.m. and services will begin at 7:15 p.m. Women's Network and Men's Club invite you to a brunch on February 11th with Dr. Richard Laub recounting his paleontological and archaeological work.



(What's Happening at CRS)

The month of January was full of activities! Grades six and seven had lessons with Rabbis Alex, Brent and Rich. CRS students, parents and staff enjoyed a wonderful time at the square-dancing Havdalah at CSS. This event really demonstrated an increase in engagement of parents from TBZ, TBT and CSS as volunteers at the school. Our kosher kitchen was utilized to prepare all the kosher food for the event! We are looking forward to expanding our cooking this way for the community.

In January the 5th graders had an in-depth look into the meaning of community at a family education program with Rabbi Rich. The students all learned and celebrated Tu-Bishvat, even making special birdfeeders for the winter in the Ganainu program with Morah Ashirah!

For me one of the highlights was seeing the Israel teen connection come to fruition. Students in 6th grade from CRS and Kadimah learned about the artist Hanoch Piven and his work. Each student prepared a self-portrait which they shared at our first zoom meeting with 6th graders in Israel. Our students demonstrated sensitivity to the Israeli teens as they shared having to get to mamad (shelter) when sirens sound. Our students were excited to share their passions for video games, make-up and craft making with the Israeli teens. I look forward to the continuation of this collaboration.

While February is a short month at CRS we are looking forward to the Superbowl Friday night service at TBT on February 9th. Our 6th graders and their parents will learn together at their family education program on February 11th. We are planning to see the play Kindertransport at the JRT with our 5th-7th graders and a group from the Better Together program at Amberleigh Senior Living. In February we are also excited to welcome our guest teacher Gon Erez, who will be leading sessions on the current situation in Israel for students in grades 5-7 and their parents. This program will be open to the general community as well with the leadership and support of the Israel Task Force- a group of community members, teachers, mental health workers, and concerned and committed individuals. I thank them deeply for being in the forefront of activism and support to our students and adults since October 7th.

This year CRS students, teachers, parents and leadership has committed to collect all the weekly Tzedakah along with additional donations from our families and the greater Buffalo community and send it to Israel. We have partnered with the Hasten Family Foundation to provide funds to Israelis in need. Now more than ever American Jews can play a crucial role in assisting Israelis from all walks of life. The fund has no overhead so 100% of every dollar raised goes directly to those in need. This partnership will enable direct response and feedback from the recipients, so the students will be able to see the impact of their Tzedakah.

The specific recipients include:

- 1) Israelis that have been evacuated from their homes in both the north and south. The total number of people is over 200,000. The fund buys gift cards from a major retailer in Israel and distributes them to evacuees in need of clothing, food, etc. The gift cards empower those in need to buy what they need without feeling like they are being given a handout. Furthermore the fund purchases the gift cards at a 10% discount enabling your donation to go even further.
- 2) Soldiers in need of warm clothing and other items not currently being supplied by the Israeli government. Given that 350,000 soldiers have been called to duty the government has been overwhelmed and many of the soldiers needs are falling through the cracks. The fund works with experts who are in touch with commanders in the field as well as the Ministry of Defense to ascertain the needs and supply whatever is needed.
- 3) Children who have lost one or both parents as a result of the attack on October 7. The children are being provided both immediate financial assistances, as well as a goal of \$200,000 per child to be used when they turn 18 for major life events. After turning 18, government assistance is minimal and thus the fund aims to help fill that gap.
- 4) The Shalev family from Kibbutz Be'eri. The family survived the attack on their kibbutz, but their home was burned down while they hid in a safe room. They have three young children and have temporarily relocated to Denver to heal. The fund has been assisting them with living expenses and therapy costs.

As you can see the needs are endless and we are honored to be able to provide any assistance we can. Thank you in advance for your participation and open heart. Together we can help Israel move forward and once again thrive.


