From the Rabbi

How many of you have fallen victim to AutoCorrect? It happens when you type something on your phone or computer only to have that word changed by the device. Many times, AutoCorrect is our friend, altering misspelled words that might have otherwise embarrassed us. The trouble is, if your word of choice was AutoCorrected to something you *didn't intend, and if you didn't notice the change, you might wind up embarrassing yourself even more.*

We're surrounded by technology intended to make our lives easier. But we often find that additional gadgets lead to only more complications. The truth is, there isn't a single machine that can provide us with the real solutions to living more meaningful and fulfilling lives.

In other words, when it comes to our mistakes and wrongdoings, we can't depend on something else "AutoCorrecting" our lives; instead, we need to rely on ourselves to make things right.

When we begin the new year of 5783 this month, we'll once again delve into the process of reflection and repentance, knowing that, try as we might, we have yet to reach our full potential, even if we have made positive strides. In the past year, all of us have experienced a mixture of triumph and tragedy, laughter and tears. And yes, we ultimately must find it within ourselves to improve the way we live. But we need assistance, friendly nudges along the way. Machines can help to measure our progress and provide shortcuts for long projects, but it is our human support system, our friends and family that gives us the strength to move forward with confidence.

And so we'll gather during the High Holidays to remind ourselves that correction is not automatic, but gradual; it doesn't come from something with an on/off switch, but rather with the living and breathing people just a handshake and hug away.

In this new year, let us reach out to these people we love, to the community that nurtures us, and to the principles of Torah that make us whole and gives us hope.

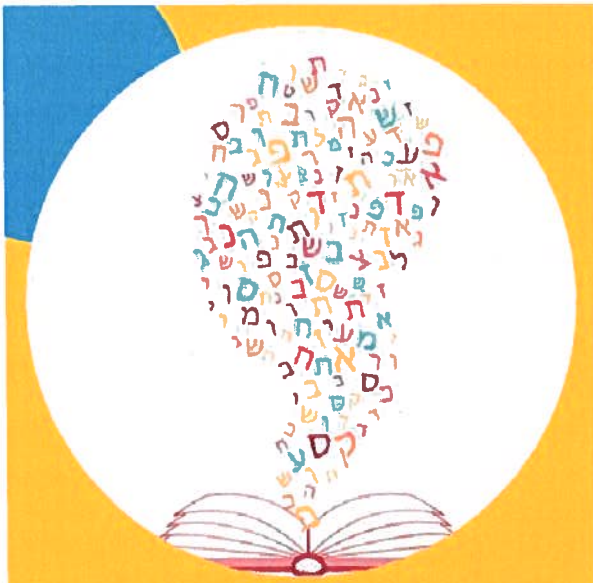

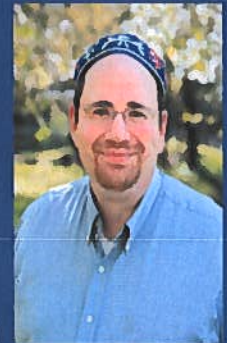

The *Lev Shalom mahzor* quotes Isaiah 57:19 in a welcoming prayer as Rosh Hashanah's evening service begins: Shalom, shalom to all who are far off; shalom to all who are near, says Adonai.

It is a prayer for peace as we recite the liturgy for the High Holidays. It is even more poignant this year when we are still not certain who will be present and who will be on livestream. Have you decided yet what you will do? We plan on having one service in the sanctuary, with overflow seating via a video link, in the newly renovated social hall. Truly, we have no idea how many people will come. For those who are plan on watching on our livestream, there will be drive in events to borrow a *mahzor* on September 18 and 22, with return dates in October. At a recent gathering of presidents of the Buffalo area shuls, we all shared the uncertainty of how we emerge from COVID precautions and restrictions. Mah Koreh B'CRS? (What's Happening at CRS) *From the desk of Einav Symons*



As Rosh Hashanah can be felt on the horizon, it brings with it a promise of new beginnings... First, I truly hope it is the beginning of a healthy year, not restricted by Covid!

The Community Religious School serves the students of Temple Beth Tzedek, Temple Beth Zion, Congregation Shir Shalom and unaffiliated families. One community, one community school. CRS provides engaging curriculum which includes Holidays, Israel, Torah, Ethics/Values, Life cycle, History, Art and Music. The Hebrew curriculum is taught as private, remote lessons to students from 1st through 7th grade. Hebrew is reinforced during T'fillah time on Sundays. This initiative has been highly successful and was well received by the students:

- "I loved learning Hebrew! It gave me time to work privately and at my own pace." (Evelyn F, 3rd grade)
- "I really like Hebrew online tutoring because it is one-on-one and when I make mistakes, it is not in front of the whole class, and I don't get embarrassed." (Hannah C., 4th grade)
- "Online tutoring helped me a lot. I started the year not knowing any Hebrew. It was easy to get on Zoom meetings. I was excited to learn how to read within few months!" (Ramona G, 6th grade)

As the Community Religious school is embarking on its second year, new initiatives such as expanding the Hebrew one-on-one to 1st and 2nd graders and new curriculum intensives for 6th and 7th graders are going to be implemented. Since we are not limited by social distancing this year, we are excited to be planning various social opportunities for our students and their families such as apple picking, Havdalah, and Friday night dinners. CRS is further collaborating with LiNK and the JCC to enhance programming for all ages.

Opening day for the 2022-2023 school year is September 11th. A drone will be capturing the parents, holding Talitot, as their children begin the new year. All parents are invited to a Zoom parent orientation on September 15th at 7:30pm. Ganainu will meet on September 18th, and the whole community is encouraged to join us at apple picking on September 25th. Please check our school calendar on our website www.crsbuffalo.com where you will also find the latest updates and information.

I want to thank the numerous donors who freely stepped forward to support the Community Religious School, even without being asked. I thank you for recognizing the importance of a successful, consolidated, and collaborative quality Jewish education in Buffalo.

As the Director of CRS, it is my mission to foster an organization that lives up to its name: it is the Community Religious School, made by and for our community. I will ensure that at our school, all are heard, represented, and can find meaningful connections as they embark on their own unique Jewish journeys.

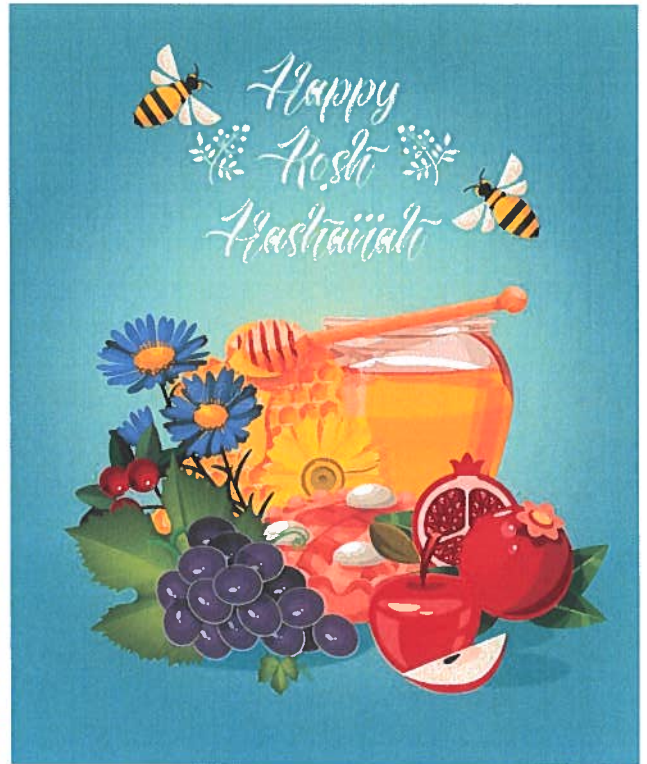


What is Reverse Tashlich?

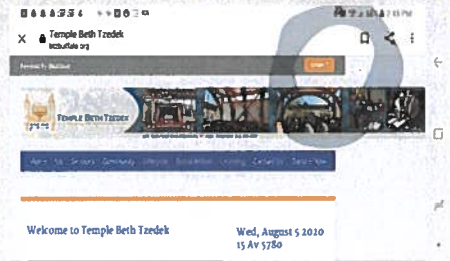
