From the Rabbi

As we are about to begin reading the book of Exodus at synagogue, we are introduced to key examples of how water became an ultimate symbol of both life and death in the Jewish tradition, how an element so essential can reflect both our best possibilities and worst experiences.

In a few brief sentences near the beginning of the book, we read that Pharoah tells his advisers to "deal shrewdly" with the Israelites to prevent them from rising up against the Egyptians in battle. Many commentators ask, what is so shrewd about oppressing a people by force? Does this reflect strategy, or just brutality?

Rashi believes that the word "shrewdly" does not refer to enslavement itself, but rather the subsequent decision to kill all male Israelites by drowning them in the Nile River. He believes that Pharaoh knows the Israelite story of the flood, in which God promises that water would never be used to destroy the earth again. Since the Israelites themselves know of this covenant, they would not suspect that anything would happen to their baby sons in the Nile. Rashi's theory is only just that. But whether or not Pharoah knows exactly what he is doing, his policy is effective, as water becomes a place of death for our ancestors.

But we later find that water is also a symbol for life. When God tells Moses of the plans to liberate the Israelites from slavery, God foresees Pharaoh ignoring Moses' pleas for freedom. God hints that the very first plague will involve turning the Nile into blood. Even

God cannot ignore how the water can bring the Israelites hope in the face of death.

We see today that water is both dangerous and lifegiving. The extreme severity of storms – some of which we've experienced in Buffalo in recent weeks – coupled with environmentalist concerns about the future of icecaps and our shorelines, remind us of the hardship that water can cause. At the same time, we need it more than ever. Doctors and nutritionists almost unanimously teach how essential water is to our diets. Even though this nation never seems to run out of soda, most people admit that water is the one beverage we can never do without. The need for water has informed so many important decisions, not the least of which have included the peace treaties in the Middle East, which have often hinged on nations agreeing on fair ways to get access to water.

So we see that water can be a source of pain or prosperity, depending on how we use it. As we have started a new year, we are best served when we remember that, just like water or any other key element, each human being has the power of both life and death, both the opportunity for success and the prospect of failure, both the chance for joy and possibility of sorrow. And so, let us turn to words near the end of the Torah: choose life.



Tu B'Shevat is the 15th day of the Jewish month of Shevat. It is also known as the New Year for Trees. This year it is celebrated on Monday, February 6, 2023.

CRS students are busy! December provided opportunities to learn and celebrate Chanukah, both as a school and as part of the greater Buffalo Jewish community! There was also a beautiful Havdalah at TBZ for students in grades pre-k to 2nd grade led by Rabbi Gutmann. The Madrichim (Grades 8-12) gathered for an ice-cream social on a Sunday afternoon and had an opportunity to share how they see and express their own Jewish identity. In December, six students in our Better 2 Learn Program travelled to Brandeis (allexpense paid) and participated with teens from around the country in a 4-day intensive study.

Our Hebrew 1-1 tutors continue advancing at a great pace with their students. Yishar Koach! Our grades 6th and 7th students are engrossed in a pottery project with Cathy Shuman Miller.
