Dear Friends:

As we prepare for Pesach, our attention turns in particular to two important mitzvot: providing for the poor, and getting rid of all hametz. As for hametz, I suggest these three standard methods:

1. Use up as much as possible, especially *hametz she-b'ayin*, "things that look like hametz," e.g. pasta, bread, cakes, cereal.
2. Give away whatever you will not consume. Unopened packages may be contributed to the TBT Food Barrel before Thursday, April 10th; opened packages may be given to non-Jewish friends and neighbors.
3. For *hametz* that you cannot give away or that would cause financial hardship to give away (e.g. bottles of liquor), fill out the form below, and I will serve as your Transfer Agent to execute a contract to:
 1. Sell (transfer legal title of) said foods to a non-Jew (as of Friday April 11th at 10:00 am) and
 2. Rent cabinet storage space in your home to the same non-Jewish person, so s/he does not have to physically move it off your premises before Pesach.
 3. If the non-Jewish person wants to back out of the deal after Pesach, I will arrange for title to revert to you after the holiday.

Note: Because Passover begins when Shabbat ends on Saturday night April 12th, you should designate *hametz* that you will be eating from Friday afternoon through Shabbat morning, which are not covered by this sale. All *hametz* not included in the sale should be eaten before 10:45 am on Shabbat morning. Whatever is not eaten must be removed from the home by 11:50am Shabbat morning. It may be destroyed on Shabbat by flushing down a toilet, or throwing it into a public garbage.

This is also the season for collecting and distributing Ma'ot Hittim, money to help the poor buy Passover food and supplies. Members of our community are counting on your generosity.

From The Rabbi

We have a rare situation this year (occurring just 12% of the time!), with the Passover Seder beginning on a Saturday night. We need to complete our preparations before Shabbat, but with the seder not starting until the evening, Shabbat itself is in a strange state of limbo. Normally we search for chametz (leaven) the night before the seder and destroy it that morning. We also refrain from eating matzah on the day of the seder, so that we build up our appetite to savor our first bites of matzah during the seder.

What then does this mean for Shabbat? Here are the main details to keep in mind:

- ◆ Bedikat Chametz (Search) takes place after sundown on Thursday April 10th.
- ◆ Bi'ur Chametz (Dispose) takes place by noon on Friday April 11th. However, do not yet recite the formula of Bittul Chametz (Nullification).
- ◆ The sale of chametz takes effect Friday morning for all of your chametz except any that you chose to set aside to eat on Friday night or Shabbat morning.
- ◆ For Friday night dinner, you may eat challah or other chametz, just watch those crumbs!
- ◆ Any remaining chametz should be consumed by 10:45 AM on Shabbat morning.
- ◆ Anything not eaten should be must be removed from the home by 11:50am Shabbat morning. Since we are limited with the ways that we can destroy chametz on Shabbat, you can flush small amounts of chametz down a toilet (if it won't mess up your plumbing) or throw it into a public garbage.
- ◆ When you eat or dispose of your last chametz, you then recite the Bittul Chametz (Nullification) formula.
- ◆ Alternatively, you can eat your last chametz on Friday, and use egg matzah for your Friday night meal and throughout the day on Saturday.
- ◆ When you light candles on Friday night, light a Yahrzeit candle that will last until the next evening. You can then use this flame to kindle the Passover candles on Saturday night.

Timing also presents a challenge for those of us who are not night owls. Traditionally the Seder begins after dark because that is when the Israelites left Egypt, and this is especially important on Shabbat, because we cannot shorten the length of Shabbat to move into the next day, even if it is another holiday.

This year, Shabbat does not end on April 12th until 8:36 PM, which is a late start to the seder, and prohibitively late for young children. Based on a teshuva (responsum) written by Rabbi Joshua Heller for the Conservative Movement's Committee on Jewish Law & Standards, I recommend the following: Recite kiddush on the first cup of wine, but skip the blessings for Havdalah (the blessings that end "borei me'orei haesh" and "hamavdil bein kodesh l'kodesh") that are included for Saturday night. Proceed with your seder, but try to coordinate so that you reach the second cup of wine around 8:20 pm. At this point, use the pre-existing flame to light your Yom Tov candles, and after blessing the second cup of wine, also recite the Havdalah blessings. You can then continue with your seder and your meal.

I am happy to answer any questions you have.

Most importantly, may you celebrate in good health, with family and friends, enjoying the sweet taste of freedom!

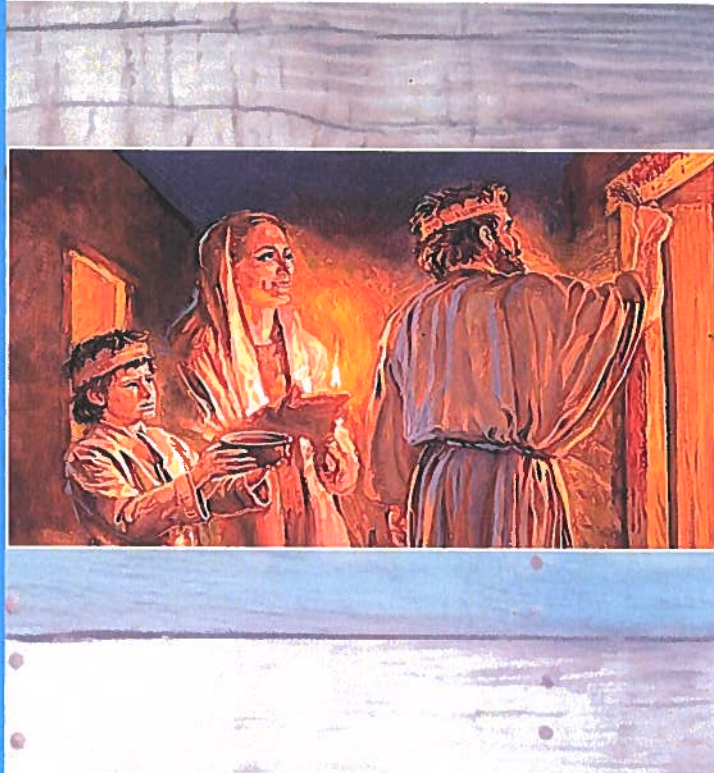

From the President

When I was very young, my grandparents and parents had no idea they were creating lasting memories for me, my sister Michele, and our cousins Lynn and Susan. Passover at my Bobie (that's how she spelled Bubbie) and Zadie's house left a lasting impression on me. While my Zadie, my father, and Uncle Benny were at Shul, my Bobie my mother, and my aunts—Ann, Jean, and Shirley—were bustling around the small Shoreham kitchen, heating up dinner and putting the finishing touches on the preparations for our Seder and meal. The table was set with special Passover china, silverware, and glasses. Even as children, we could tell these dishes were different from the everyday ones.

When the men returned from Shul, they would have their schnapps, and we'd all take our seats at the table. Zadie, with a large pillow behind him, would sit at the head of the table. Each of us had a Maxwell House Haggadah in hand. The entire Seder was conducted in Hebrew, and the children were allowed to sip some Mogen David wine, while the adults enjoyed Malaga wine. It was a very traditional Seder, and when Zadie went to wash his hands, we'd sneak off to hide the afikomen in the grand piano.

The Seder seemed to stretch on for hours. We eagerly waited for the door to be opened for Elijah, sitting very still as we imagined Elijah entering and drinking the wine. Bobie, with help from Aunt Jean and Aunt Shirley, served an unforgettable meal. The delicious aromas of Passover food filled the house, and the table was filled with many courses and an abundance of dishes. Dessert consisted of tea and a variety of beautiful baked goods, sponge cake, along with dried fruits and nuts still in their shells.

Dinner couldn't be complete until Zadie searched for the hidden Afikomen. When he couldn't find it, we'd strike a deal, allowing us to finish the Seder. Afterward, during Chol HaMoed, Aunt Jean would take the us to a toy store, where we could choose toys from Zadie.

Bobie and Zadie never realized how these simple moments with us would become cherished memories that would last a lifetime.

After Zadie passed away, new traditions began. Time changes, but our memories remain forever. I hope everyone at your Passover table is creating precious memories for all the kinderlakh.

For many years now, my sister Michele and Lance have hosted our Passover Seder. Below is one of the recipes I make every year. It may not be my Bobie's recipe, but it's one of Lance's Passover favorites.

This Farfel Recipe was submitted by Muriel Narotsky to the Shaarey Zedek Kosher Kitchen 2 cookbook. I have made a few changes.

Passover Farfel

1 large onion chopped in small pieces
¼ cup oil
3 1/2 cups Matzo Farfel
16 1/2 ounces of chicken or vegetable broth
¼ tsp. pepper
2 tsp. paprika
Salt as needed

Sauté onions in oil until tender, using a large skillet. Add Matzo Farfel and stir until lightly browned.

Combine seasoning and broth. Add slowly to the skillet and cook over low heat, stirring frequently, until all the liquid is absorbed.

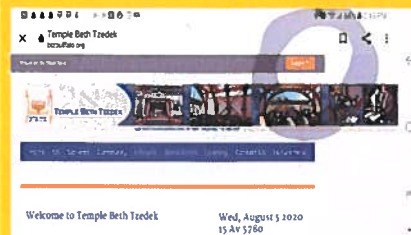
