

### From the Rabbi

Too often, good ideas get lost in the shuffle because we assume that they are non-starters, because we think that no one will find them compelling.

A lesson to the contrary was taught to the graduates of the College of William & Mary. At a recent commencement exercise, Willis Group Holdings chief executive Joseph J. Plumeri told this story:

There's this big building in Chicago called the Sears Tower ... I told people I'm going to rename it the Willis Tower. They said to me: "You can't do that. It's impossible. That name has been on there since 1973. Who are you to come along and change the name?" I said that Sears hadn't been in the building since 1993; why not? I met with the owner of the building ... I said that the problem with the Sears Tower is the name. It's a jinx. I said you need a new name, a vibrant name, a name that signifies the future, not the past. ... When we dedicated that building, I was on the evening news with Brian Williams and he said to me, "How, Joe, after so many years it was called the Sears Tower, how did you get them to change the name to Willis?" And I looked into the camera and I said, "I asked."

Plumeri reminds us that sometimes just asking the question gets us farther than we ever thought possible. Rather than assuming that we have to do things the same way all the time, we can improve our lives by asking, "Why not?"

The Talmudic tractate of Berachot tells a story of what happens when we're too timid to ask. Isaiah the prophet and Hezekiah, the Judean king at the time, are at first punished by God because each thought that the other should come to visit him. God strikes Hezekiah with illness, and only then does Isaiah go to him, and that's only after God demands it. Isaiah's visit makes a drastic difference, and Hezekiah is luckily able to recover.

This tale begs the question, how many conflicts would be solved if one person would simply break the ice and approach the other? How many great ideas are lost in the shuffle because we don't bother to bring them forward?

Isaiah and Hezekiah learn this lesson, albeit the hard way. Thankfully, we don't have to wait for dire circumstances to speak up before it's too late.

Tu B'Shevat, the New Year for Trees, is one of my favorite, albeit often overlooked, holidays. Debbie Friedman sang of trees: Let's dig a hole and plant a seed, let's water it, oh, because its Tu B'Shevat, Trees are blowing in the wind. Whoosh! Shel Silverstein wrote about The Giving Tree, a favorite children's tale. When I was a child, my dad planted trees to replace those killed by Dutch Elm disease.




Join Rabbi Adam J. Rosenbaum and Zahava Fried as we explore Torah and prayer through a new lense!




