Elizabeth Huntington Coley Fox (1895-1973) was an artist, school teacher and resident of New Rochelle from 1928 to 1947. As a life member of the Art Students League of New York and the New Rochelle Art Association, she created oil paintings and watercolors infused with a love of the natural world and guided by an intense but expressive spirituality. Fox was also a devoted patron of the library, which exhibited her artwork in the 1950s and 1960s.
