## Law Firm Offers Free Evaluation of Auto Insurance Policies

Back in 2019, Michigan lawmakers passed sweeping No-Fault Auto Reform Legislation. Under the new laws (effective in 2020), Michigan auto insurance companies were no longer obligated to provide mandatory unlimited medical coverage for auto-related injuries. While the changes have resulted in a modest reduction in premiums, the coverage available for serious injuries has been dramatically reduced.

The new law provides for a "cafeteria" style approach to medical expense coverage. Medicare recipients (along with others in their household), may "opt-out" of medical expense coverage entirely. Medicaideligible persons may purchase a minimum coverage of \$50,000 (limited availability under this option.) Motorists may choose between three types of medical coverage options: limits of \$250,000, \$500,000, or unlimited coverage.

Make sure that you and your loved ones are properly covered should a serious injury automobile accident occur.
