## **December Remarks from Our Pastors**

In their reports to Council each month, Pastor Gregg and Pastor Rachel conclude with some personal remarks that summarize the most recent period of their leadership here at Grace.

## Senior Pastor's Remarks:

I remember what it was like being new here at Grace. I remember how the congregation seemed friendly, and there was always plenty to do, lots to learn. I remember wanting to get up-to-speed as quickly as possible. Several of you reading this helped me with that in a variety of ways, and I am grateful for that. Some of you helped by showing me the way Grace approaches its ministry. Others helped by inviting me to share what insight I already brought, allowing us to collaborate from the start. Sig Huitt introduced me to some people around town, taking me to a few community meetings and making sure I knew the larger picture of Rock Hill's story. Because of all this help, I was in a better position to serve and to lead. The assistance was invaluable – all of it. Last week, I got to pay that forward a little bit.

Pastor Rachel and I shared a lunch with our newest colleague, the Rev. Lucas Caine Crossland. Fr. Lucas is the new rector down the street at Our Saviour. We could relate, in a way, since we came to Rock Hill from North Carolina, too. We got to share with him lots of info about the city and the broader area. We knew great restaurants to recommend, which places he could visit, and so on. Fr. Lucas wanted to know which community groups he might want to join, and we shared some of our thoughts. I was able to connect him with our Campus Minister and a few local leaders, as others had done for me. The more we talked – that day and since – I have been encouraged to realize how much I've come to learn about this place and the people who live here with us. In fact, being able to help someone else in this way has been a real source of joy!

I mention this to you today because I want you to share in this experience. Most of you reading this have been in town longer than I have. Most of you have been members of Grace longer than I have, too. And I have phenomenal news: **new people are still coming!** Even if you have just arrived, you already have valuable information, obtained simply from your personal experiences. I pray you do not keep this resource to yourself! Instead, please be on the lookout for new faces. Maybe they are totally new, or maybe you just haven't met them yet. Either way, please introduce yourself. Strike up a conversation with an unfamiliar person at Grace. We all want the strongest congregation possible, and a key component of that strength will be the impression we give to new people. We are the ones who've been here; that means <u>we</u> must be the ones to 'break the ice' and say hello. Then, you can share with me the joy of finding out how much you already know, and how much you are able to share with a grateful newcomer. Trust me; it's worth the effort!
