70 YEARS OF JOY, MEANING, AND BELONGING

Temple Beth Am marks a powerful milestone this evening: 70 years of creating a Jewish home together! With this occasion, Temple Beth Am's Platinum Anniversary, we continue a year of celebrating the people and stories that make up our thriving community, while honoring the significance of the number 70 in Judaism.

Since the start of 5786, we have honored and shared each decade of our rich history with you through archival material, stories, and photographs.

Our story began in the 1950s and 60s with a group of families in North Seattle searching for Jewish connection close to their homes, who wanted to have their unique voices heard in their practice of Judaism. By the end of the 60s, we had our permanent location; our first long-term rabbi, Rabbi Norman Hirsh; our own torahs; and a small but dedicated community.

In the many decades since Beth Am's humble beginnings, we've built a thriving progressive congregation in NE Seattle thanks to you and your dedication! Sponsors and guests here tonight have both familiar and fresh faces. The strength of our community is the connection between members since the 1970s and new friends that may have just joined last year.

Our membership has grown from a few families searching for a new way to be Jewish in NE Seattle to hundreds of families that build connections across the region. We've gone from one part-time clergy member and a few dozen households, to three rabbis, a full worship team, and 900 families. Our beautiful sanctuary and school building in Wedgewood, gifted to us by past generations, has rooted our community in Seattle and beyond.

Under Rabbi Ruth in 2016, we developed our first mission statement: "We deepen relationships to Judaism and our community by engaging the soul, heart, and mind." This helped us codify our long-standing focus on connections and community.

From our members who are no longer with us—may their memories be blessings—to those who are newly engaged, we honor your commitment to Temple Beth Am!

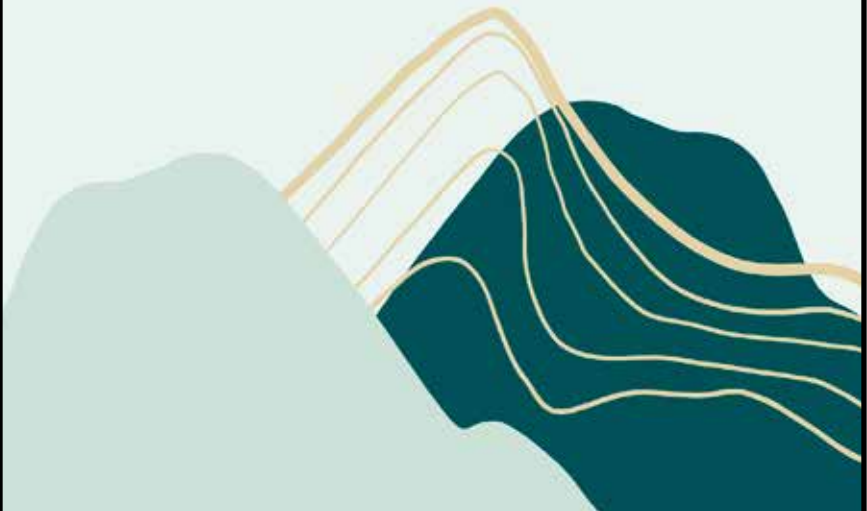


