About This Project

IMPROVEMENTS

Beginning May 2021, Halton Region will be constructing a new roundabout at the intersection of Appleby Line (Reg. Rd. 20) and Britannia Road, Ward 6, City of Burlington (see attached map). This work is required to improve the flow of traffic and to enhance the safety for motorists in the area.

As part of this project, a temporary road closure will be required on Britannia Road west of Appleby Line. This closure will be in the early stages of construction for a duration of approximately two weeks. Furthermore, a temporary weekend road closure will also be required on both Appleby Line and Britannia Road to facilitate the final paving of the new roundabout. This closure will be near the end of the construction project. **Separate project notices will be sent to residents in advance of these road closures indicating the exact dates of closure and detour routes.** Emergency vehicle access and local access will be maintained at all times.

The contractor for this project is **Pave-It Limited** with project administration by **GHD Limited**. Construction is anticipated to be completed by **December 2021**, weather permitting.

PLANNING AHEAD

To help you plan ahead for construction activity, please read the project related information below. Wherever possible, mitigation plans will be put in place to minimize disruptions.

Driveway access: Direct access to your driveway may be restricted for short periods of time. We will provide advance notice of any planned restrictions.

Dust and mud: There may be increased levels of dust and mud near the work site. The contractor is required to manage these impacts.

Lawn irrigation system: If you have a lawn irrigation system within the public road allowance, please locate, disconnect and remove any sprinkler heads prior to the construction work commencing. Halton Region will not be responsible for damaging irrigation systems that are located within the public road allowance.

Mail delivery: We do not anticipate any changes or delays to mail delivery. We will provide advance notice if there are any changes.

Night work: Night work may be required as part of this project. We will provide advance notice of any change in work hours.

Noise: You may experience noise as a result of this work. We will schedule work in accordance with local noise by-laws.

Precondition photos: In the coming weeks, a Halton Region representative will take photos of the project site before the project begins.

Property restoration: Final property restoration will be completed towards the end of the project (weather permitting).

- If your driveway has been impacted by this work, the contractor will inform you in advance of the driveway restoration work to allow the vehicles to be removed from the driveway or out of the garage as required. The section of your driveway that is impacted will be restored.
- If your lawn has been impacted by this work, new sod will be placed. This work may be delayed, depending on weather, to improve chance of the sod surviving.

Traffic delays: This work will cause traffic delays, lane shifts or lane restrictions. We will make every effort to minimize any potential inconvenience. Emergency vehicle access will be maintained at all times.

Tree removals: To accommodate the construction works, some tree removals have been completed in early spring 2021. In the event, additional tree removal or pruning is needed in front of your property, the Region will advise you of the impact and mitigation measures during construction.

Truck traffic: You will notice occasional increases in truck traffic around the ongoing work. Please be aware and use extra caution while driving.

Vibration: You may experience some vibration due to ongoing work. As a precaution, we recommend that you remove or secure objects on shelves and walls.

Waste collection: Your garbage and recycling will continue to be picked up on your regular scheduled collection day. The contractor is responsible for moving your garbage and recycling to a location where our collection vehicles can pick them up. Please mark your house number on containers or bins to help with identification.

Well water monitoring: Halton Region has been monitoring the well water in the area since **2018** and will continue to do so during construction and for a couple of months after completion of construction.

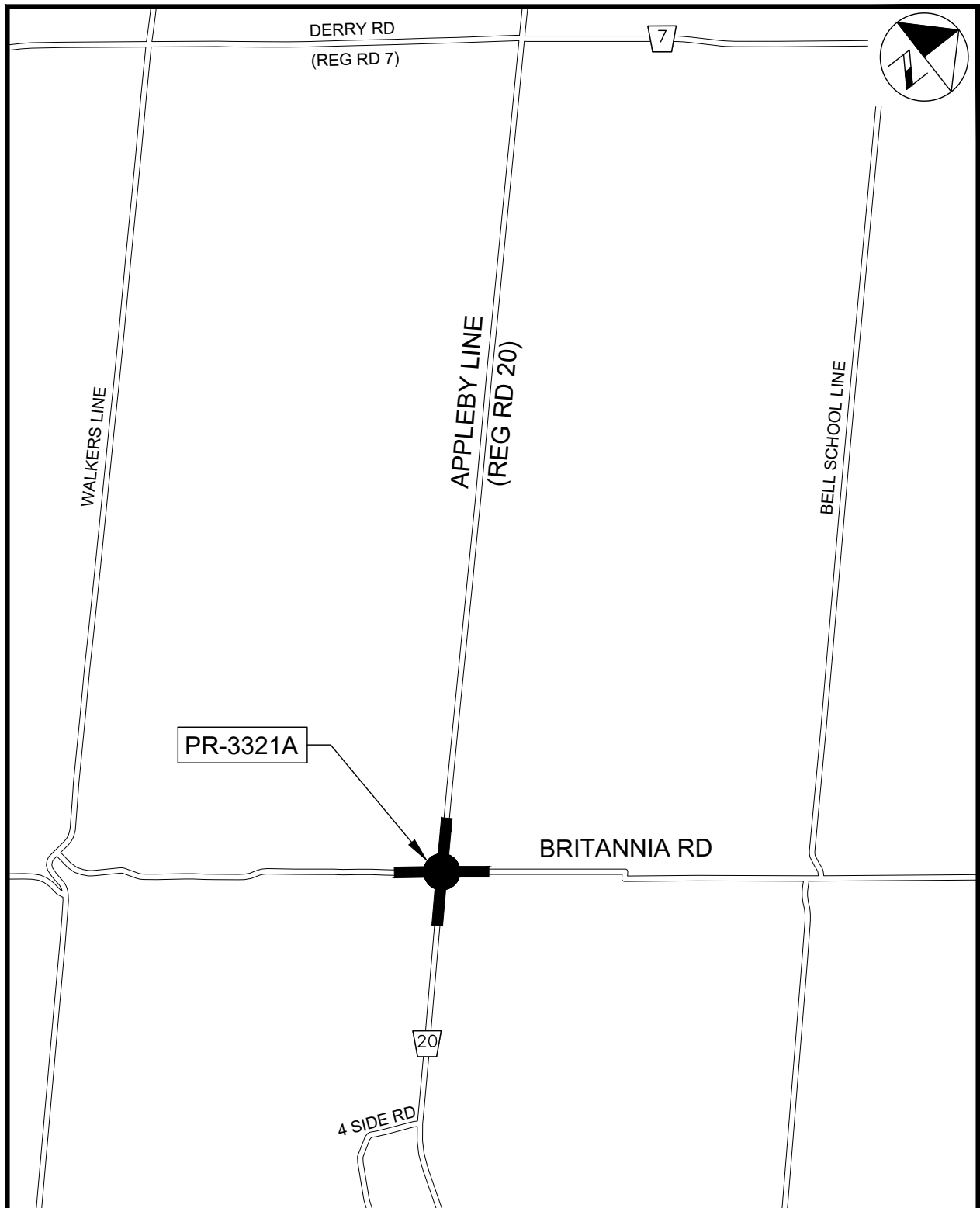
Erosion and sediment controls: We will install erosion and sediment control measures for the duration of the project, including a tree protection fence with heavy-duty silt fabric around the perimeter of the project site.
